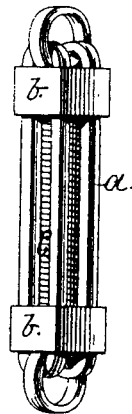

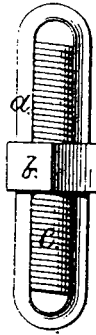
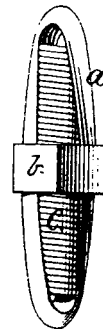

BENEDICT LEDERER, OF PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND.

## DESIGN FOR AN ORNAMENTAL CHAIN-LINK.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,004**, dated January 28, 1879; application filed November 21, 1878.

[Term of patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, BENEDICT LEDERER, of the city and county of Providence, and State of Rhode Island, have originated a new Design for an Ornamental Chain-Link, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification.

Figure 1 represents a chain-link in which two loops inclose a beaded or twisted wire, the whole surrounded by a square sleeve at or near each end of the link. Fig. 2 represents a chain-link in which a loop of wire incloses a beaded or twisted wire, the whole surrounded at or near the middle of the link by a square sleeve. Fig. 3 represents a chain-link in which a loop of wire incloses a beaded or twisted wire, the whole surrounded at or near the middle of the link by a square sleeve, the loop being twisted.

*b* represents the sleeves, (one, two, or more may be used on one link;) *a*, the loop, made of drawn or rolled wire of any desired section; *c*, the central wire, which may be a twisted coil of small wire, a beaded wire, or an open spiral coil. The central ornamental wire should be made of different color from the rest of the link; or it may be of dead color, and the link burnished.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for an ornamental chain-link, consisting of the loop *a* and central coiled wire, *c*, surrounded by the cubical sleeves *b*, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawings.
