## DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTAL CHAIN-LINKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,017, dated February 4, 1879; application filed December 26, 1878.

[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DOLIVER S. SPAULDING, of Mansfield, of the county of Bristol and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Design for Ornamental Chain-Links; and do hereby declare the same to be described in the following specification and represented in the accompanying drawing, which is a view of a semi-link with my design, the link being composed of two of such half-links.

The design consists of two shields, a a, a connecting - bar, b, and open - work scallops c c, projecting from a shield in manner as shown. Each of the said shields, as represented, has an ornamental border, d, and is grooved diametrically at right angles, as shown

Instead of being circular I sometimes make the shield polygonal or substantially circular or elliptical in form.

To construct a chain-link of two of such

semi-links, each of them at its middle is to be bent around semicircularly, so as to bring the shields into parallelism, or thereabout, with each other, and at a distance apart equal, or about so, to the diameter of one of them. Two half-links are next to be arranged so as to mutually embrace each other and touch together at their edges, which are to be united by solder, the bows of the middle parts, b, projecting in opposite directions. A series of such links interlinked compose a chain.

What I claim is-

A design for an ornamental-chain semi-link, consisting of the shields a, connecting-bar b, and open scallops c, substantially as above described, and as shown in the accompanying drawing.
