

## DESIGN FOR A STANDING COLLAR.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,018, dated February 11, 1879; application filed January 3, 1879. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE P. IDE, of the city of Troy, in the county of Rensselaer and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Ornamental Design for Standing Collars for Gentlemen's and Ladies' Wear, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, in which—

Figure 1 is an elevation of the outer side of a collar which embodies this invention; and Figs. 2, 3, and 4 are sections of the same at the lines z z, y y, and x x, respectively.

This invention consists in the new design for the outer side of a standing collar, the same being composed of the face portion A, band portion B, and intervening straight united ribs C C, inclined to each other and forming the obtuse angle D, all combined so as to present the new and distinctly stylish appear-

ance indicated in the aforesaid drawings, the outer edges of the face portion A and band part B being of the usual or any suitable shapes, and the ribs C C and the outer border of the collar being with or without conspicuous rows of stitching.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a standing collar, consisting of the face portion A, band portion B, and intervening straight united ribs C C, inclined to each other and forming the obtuse angle D, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
