

DESIGN FOR CARPET-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,022**, dated February 11, 1879; application filed January 18, 1879. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a carpet-pattern is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The design is of a foliated character; and consists of stems a, leaves b, blossoms or buds d, and flowers e, the spaces of the groundwork intervening between the floral or foliated parts of the design being filled with oblong spots i, as clearly shown in the illustration.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim— The, design for a carpet-pattern, said design consisting of stems, leaves, buds, and flowers, all substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying photographic illustration.
