DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,029**, dated February 18, 1879; application filed December 23, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS J. STEARNS, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and original Design for Carpets, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The design consists chiefly in the groups or bouquets of lilies *a a*, arranged on a background containing other minor floral designs, as shown.

I claim—

The design for carpets, substantially as shown and described.
