

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,630**, dated February 25, 1879; application filed December 7, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DAVID BRIGGS, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for Knitted Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

My design is shown in the accompanying

photographic illustration.

The design comprises a groundwork of loosely-knitted loops, and on this groundwork are arranged zigzag stripes or ribs of a puffed or raised character, as fully shown in the drawing.

The lines of stitches forming the groundwork may be straight, or may follow the contour of the stripes, and the latter may be arranged at any desired distance apart from each

other. Thus the puffed stripes in Fig. 2 are farther apart than those in Fig. 1.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim— The design for a knitted fabric, said design comprising a groundwork of loosely-knitted loops, on which are arranged zigzag ribs or stripes of a puffed or raised character, as shown and described.
