

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,031**, dated February 25, 1879; application filed January 18, 1879. [Term of patent 3\frac{1}{2} years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Cornelius Jackson, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for Knitted Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a knitted fabric is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration

The design consists of a series of rows, a, each composed of a number of oblong ribs or stripes, b, of a puffed or raised character, the ribs of each row being separated by spaces spanned by threads, and the ribs of one row being in line with the spaces of the adjoining rows.

I claim-

The design for a knitted fabric, said design consisting of rows of puffed or raised ribs, separated slightly from each other, the ribs of one row being in line with the spaces of the adjoining rows, all substantially as described and shown.
