

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,032, dated February 25, 1879; application filed January 18, 1879. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY A. TRUITT, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Knitted Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a knitted fabric is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The design consists of a groundwork of loosely-knitted loops, on the surface of which are arranged rows of oblong stripes or ribs a, of a puffed or raised character, the ribs of each row being arranged at some distance apart from each other, and the continuity of each rib being interrupted at or about the center by a ring or open loop, b. The ribs a of adjacent loops are staggered in respect to each other—

that is to say, the ribs a of one row are in line with the spaces between the ribs of the rows above and below the same.

I claim-

The design for a knitted fabric, said design consisting of the loosely-knitted groundwork, on which are arranged oblong ribs a, staggered in respect to each other, as described, the continuity of each rib being interrupted by a ring or open loop, b, all substantially as described and shown.
