

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,035**, dated February 25, 1879; application filed January 18, 1879. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CORNELIUS JACKSON, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Knitted Fabrie, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a knitted fabric is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The groundwork of the design is composed of loosely-knitted loops of light thread, with which are interlocked loops of heavier thread, the latter being compacted at the points shown, so as to form prominent spots a.

I claim--

The design for a knitted fabrie, said design consisting of the loosely-knitted groundwork having threads compacted at intervals, so as to form spots a, all substantially as described and shown.
