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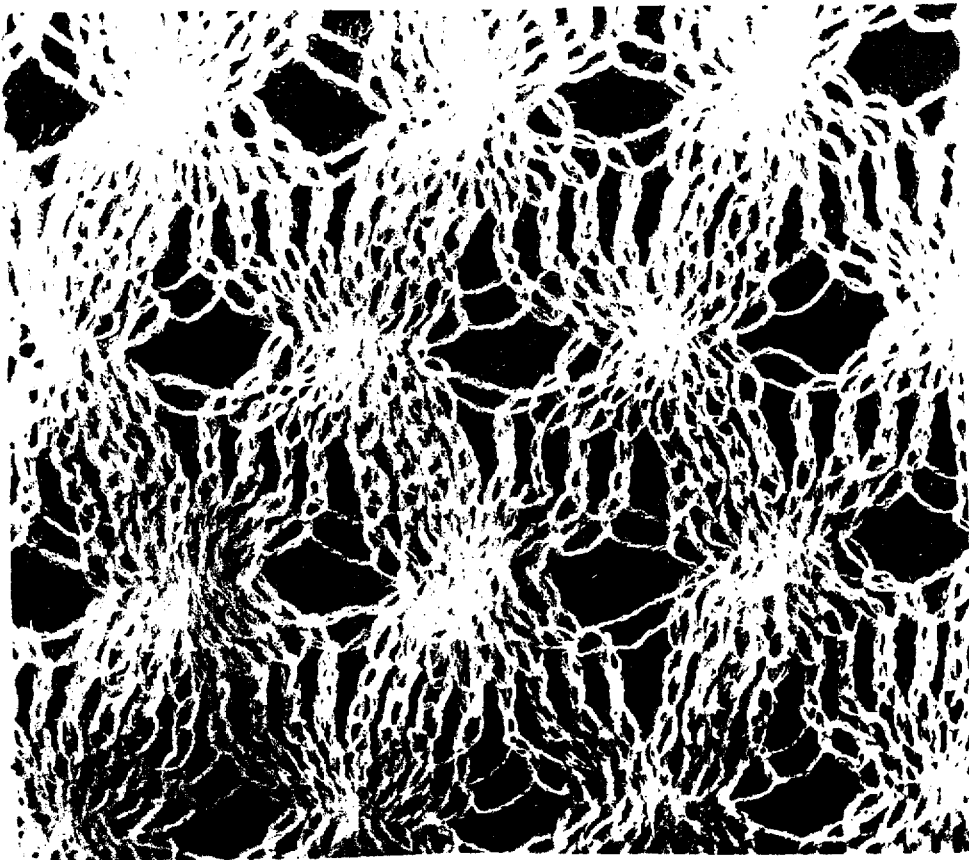

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,036**, dated February 25, 1879; application filed December 7, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY A. TRUITT, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Knitted Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a knitted fabric is shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The design comprises a series of loops of loosely-knitted threads, which are drawn together at intervals, so as to form close portions or spots *a*, between which intervene openings *b*, the general appearance of the whole design, however, being of an open or lace-like character.

I claim—

The design for a knitted fabric, said design having an open lace-like appearance, and consisting of loosely-knitted threads drawn together at intervals, so as to form spots *a* and openings *b*, as shown and described.
