

DESIGN FOR MATCH-BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,040, dated February 25, 1879; application filed January 29, 1879.

[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HERMAN ROSENBERG, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated a new and useful Design for Match-Boxes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

A represents a design for a match-box, the design being substantially a rectangular outline ornamented with lines a, representing sunken panels, and ornamented with the representation of a spout, b, and handle c at the

top of the rectangular figure, and representation of corrugations d on the bottom of the same.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for a match-box, consisting of a rectangular outline with representations of sunken panels on the sides, corrugations on the bottom, and a spout and handle on the top, substantially as described.
