## DESIGN FOR PADLOCKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,041, dated February 25, 1879; application filed February 3, 1879.

[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES H. BEEBE, of Norwich, in the county of New London and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and original Design for a Padlock, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a padlock is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, which presents the feature which forms the subject of the design, consisting of a row or line of raised dots following the outline of lock and shackle, and giving a neat appearance to both.

In the drawing, A is the front case of padlock; B, the shackle; C, the border of dots, which constitutes my new design as applied for on border of a padlock.

I am aware that a continuous raised border is old, and I do not claim this; but

What I claim is—

The design for a padlock, consisting of a row or line of dots following the border-outline of lock case and shackle, as described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawing.
