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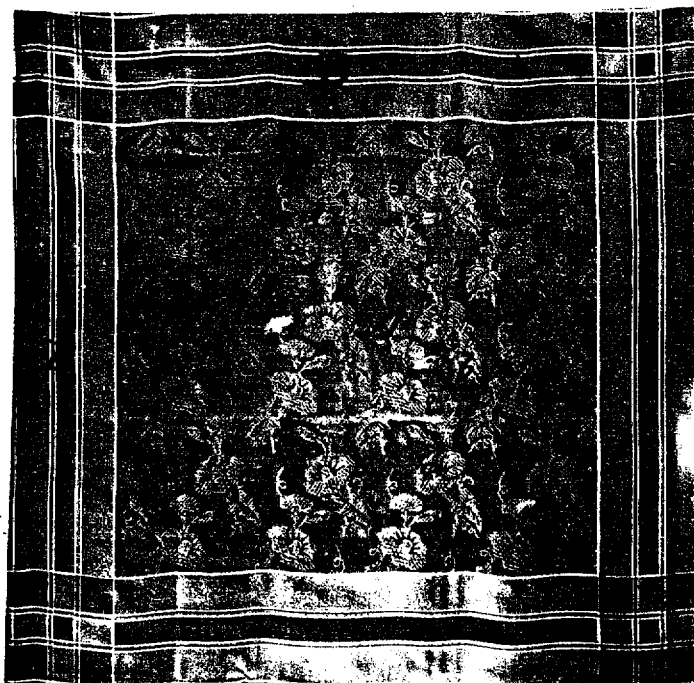

## DESIGN FOR HANDKERCHIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,013**, dated March 4, 1879; application filed January 30, 1879.  
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JOHN GRIMSHAW, of Paterson, in the county of Passaic and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Handkerchiefs, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design.

This invention relates to the new ornamentation of the body of a handkerchief.

The body A of the handkerchief contains representations of morning-glories *a*, each morning-glory having a leaf, *b*, at or near one, and buds *d* at or near the other, end. The morning-glories are arranged in rows in such

manner that those in one row are placed opposite the spaces in the adjoining rows. The flowers, leaves, and buds in each row are inclined, moreover, in opposite direction to those of the next rows. The border B is of suitable design.

I claim—

The design for the body of a handkerchief, which consists of the representation of morning-glories *a*, buds, and leaves, arranged in rows, substantially as described and shown.
