

## DESIGN FOR CARPET-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,045, dated March 4, 1879; application filed January 18, 1879. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Alfred Heald, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a carpet-pattern is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The design consists, essentially, of square figures A, separated from each other by bands B. Each of the figures A is ornamented by a broad foliated band, a, extending diagonally across it, the two remaining corners of the figure containing scroll-like ornaments b and squares d. The bands B have stripes e at each edge, and small central figures, f, arranged in line between the stripes, and, where the bands cross each other, square figures g are formed, each of these figures being composed of a number

of smaller figures or spots of a character too clearly shown to need description.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim-

1. The design for a carpet-pattern, comprising the diagonal band a, scroll-like ornaments b, and squares d, as shown and described.

2. The design for a carpet-pattern, comprising the stripes e and figures f and g, as shown and described.

3. The design for the carpet-pattern, comprising the figures A and bands B, as shown
