

## DESIGN FOR A HANDKERCHIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,051**, dated March 4, 1879; application filed January 30, 1879. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Grimshaw, of Paterson, in the county of Passaic and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Handkerchief, of which the following is a specification:

This invention relates, first, to the new ornamentation of the body of a handkerchief, and, second, to the new ornamentation of the border for the same.

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design.

The body A of the handkerchief contains two series of double and parallel stripes or bands, the double stripes a of one series intersecting the double stripes b of the other series at right angles, forming a reverse twill. At each of the intersections of the double lines a b a small square, d, is formed. The body A is, by the double stripes a b, also divided into larger squares e, as shown.

The border B of the handkerchief contains one line, f, at the inner, and another line, g, at the outer, side, and is divided by two series, h i, of three parallel lines each, into three stripes, as shown.

I claim—

- 1. The design for the body of a handkerchief, which consists of the lines a b, that form the small squares d at the intersections, and the large squares e, substantially as described and shown.
- 2. The design for the border B of a handkerchief, the same consisting of the lines f g, and of the series of lines h i, each of three parallel lines, substantially as described and shown.
