DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,055**, dated March 4, 1879; application filed November 21, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN FORRESTER, of the city of Brooklyn, county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design for a carpet.

This invention relates to a new design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric; and consists in the new arrangement and ornamentation of figures hereinafter described.

In the photograph, A represents a Chinese pagoda of two or more stories. At the base of this pagoda A is shrubbery or foliage *b*. At the right of the pagoda A is a tree, *c*.

The lower portion of the design has also

scroll or lattice work *d* at the right and left, while the center of that portion of the design between the said scroll or lattice work *d* is filled in with leaves and flowers *e* and horizontal and vertical bars *f*.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a carpet, substantially as shown in the accompanying photograph.
