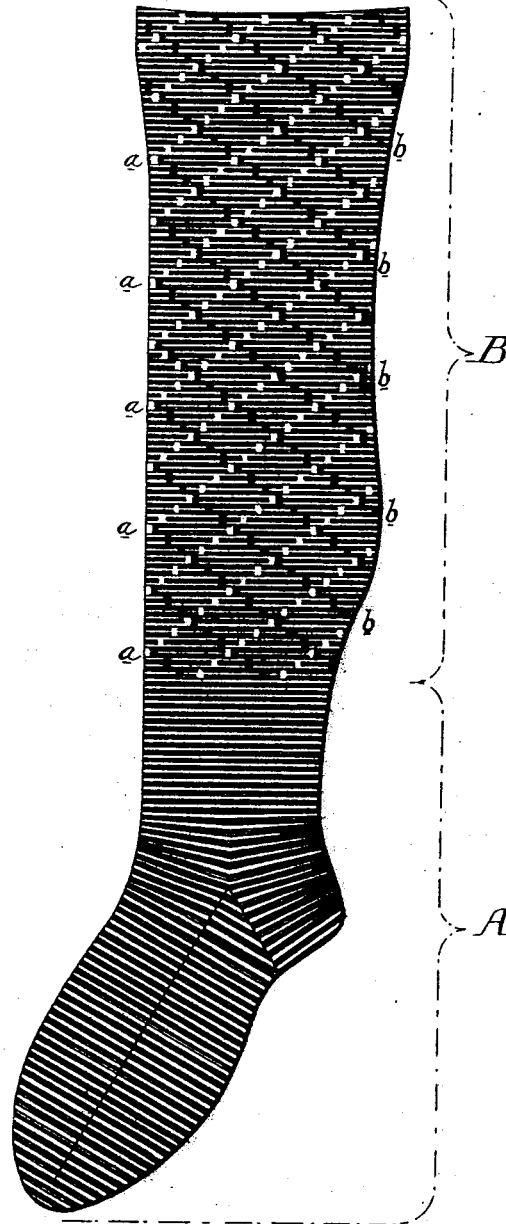

DESIGN FOR A STOCKING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,059**, dated March 11, 1879; application filed January 28, 1879.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE BRANSON, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Stocking, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a stocking is fully shown in the accompanying drawing.

The foot portion A of the stocking is of striped fabric without ornamentation; but in the leg portion B of the stocking the striped fabric has a plaid appearance imparted to it by means of diagonal stripes *a* and *b*, which extend around the leg in opposite directions, so as to cross each other and produce the plaid.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

1. The design for the leg portion B of the stocking, having a striped background and intersecting diagonal stripes *a b*, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.

2. The design for a stocking, comprising a striped foot portion, A, and leg portion B, having diagonal stripes *a b*, all substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
