

DESIGN FOR CARPET-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 11,063, dated March 11, 1879; application filed January 29, 1879.

[Term of patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a carpet-pattern is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.

The design consists, essentially, of three square figures, A, B, and D, arranged in respect to each other, as shown. The figure A has a central portion, a, composed of intersecting lines, flanked by stripes b, of the peculiar character shown. The figure B has a figured groundwork, on which are displayed stems and biossoms. The figure D is alto-

gether foliated, comprising leaves, stems, and blossoms of a character too fully shown to need description. On the groundwork of the pattern, at the corners of the figures A, B, and D, are spots d.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim— The design for a carpet-pattern, said design consisting of the figures A, B, and D, all substantially as described and shown.
