

## DESIGN FOR FUNERAL ORNAMENT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,064**, dated March 11, 1879; application filed January 24, 1879. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES H. LEARNED, of Meriden, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for a Funeral Ornament; and I do declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying illustration, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same.

The invention relates to a design for an ornament with special reference to funeral decorations—that is to say, an ornament which may be attached to a casket, or to a coffin, or to flowers, or to other parts of funeral decorations, and for analogous purposes; and it consists in the representation of the form and appearance of a palm-tree, A being the trunk, and B being the branches, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

In the illustration I have shown fruit attached to its branches, and also the representation of a flower and grasses at the foot of the tree, but which I do not regard as the essential features of the design.

What I claim is—

- 1. The herein-described design for a funeral ornament, consisting of the representation of a palm-tree, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
- 2. The herein-described design for a funeral ornament, consisting of the representation of a palm-tree, with the representation of fruit attached, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
- 3. The herein-described design for a funeral ornament, consisting of the representation of a palm-tree, with the representation of fruit attached, and with the representation of a flower and grasses at the foot of the tree, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
