DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,076**, dated March 18, 1879; application filed January 22, 1879.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDMUND PYNE, of New York, in the county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Carpets, of which the following is a specification:

This invention relates to a new and original design for carpets, oil-cloths, and similar fabrics; and consists in the new configuration and ornamentation of parts hereinafter more fully pointed out.

The accompanying photographic illustration represents a face view of a carpet made with my new design.

The design consists, essentially, of three scrolls, *a*, *b*, and *d*, which are connected to form one large continuous scroll of approximately the form of the letter L. The scrolls *a* and *d* project to the same side of the carpet, and face each other with their concave sides. The scroll *b* projects to the other side of the carpet.

The scroll *a*, which is substantially reproduced on the border B, terminates in two branches, *e* and *f*, and connects with plumes *g*, *h*, and *i*. *b* is a scroll smaller than either *a* or *d*, and forms a connecting-link for the two last-named scrolls. The scroll *d* terminates in two branches, *j* and *l*, projecting in opposite directions. A flower, *m*, is formed at the junction of the branches *j* *l*. A richly-ornamented leaf, *n*, also connects to the scroll *d*. The body A of the carpet is, moreover, decorated by an

abundant representation of flowers, leaves, scrolls, and smaller figures of various description.

The border B is made similar in appearance to the body A. It contains a substantial reproduction of the scroll *a*, and of the smaller ornaments (such as the leaf *n* and plume *g*) contained on the body A, and has, moreover, an outer bordering-strip, *o*, and an inner bordering-strip, *p*, as shown. The outer strip, *o*, is made up of a series of arch-shaped figures, while the strip *p* is composed of small ornaments.

I claim—

1. The design for a carpet, consisting of the scrolls *a*, *b*, and *d*, that form an approximately L-shaped figure, substantially as shown.
2. The design for a carpet, consisting of the plumes *g*, *h*, and *i*, and scroll *a*, substantially as shown.
3. The design for a carpet, consisting of the scroll *d*, branches *j* *l*, flower *m*, and leaf *n*, substantially as shown.
4. The design for the carpet, that consists of the scroll *a*, having branches *e* *f*; scroll *b*, scroll *d*, having branches *j* *l*, and of the plumes *g* *h* *i*, flower *m*, and leaf *n*, substantially as shown.
