



## DESIGN FOR ORNAMENTAL SCROLL-WORK FOR JEWELRY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,288, dated October 30, 1877; Reissue No. 8,300, dated June 25, 1878; application filed June 13, 1878.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LOUIS HECKMANN, of Plainville, in the county of Norfolk and State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a Scroll-Work for Articles of Jewelry, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification.

This scroll-work is intended as a trimming for shawl-pins, ear-rings, lockets, &c., for the purpose of rendering the same more orna-

mental.

In the drawings, Figure 1 is a side elevation of a piece of scroll-work executed substantially according to my design. Fig. 2 is a plan of the same, and Fig. 3 a cross-section of the fluted band.

a represents a draft-rod, upon which runs the fluted band b, touching the said rod upon its under side at each coil.

c c represent caps placed upon the upper

side of each coil of the fluted band. The shape of these caps is not material. In this illustration they are round.

The entire band b is fluted or corrugated, as seen in Fig. 3. d d are merely pegs, for the purpose of attaching the trimming to the article of jewelry for which it is intended.

The rod  $\alpha$  may be omitted, as it does not form an essential portion of my design.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for ornamental scroll-work for articles of jewelry, composed essentially of the fluted band b, provided with caps in the positions shown, said band being coiled in the shape of a scroll, substantially as described, and illustrated in the accompanying drawings.
