* Third Berlin Progress Report - September 7-October 11, 1961

The Special Working Group of the Interdepartmental Coordinating Countitée en Berlin has taken the substantive decisions reported below during the period from September 6, 1961, the date of the second progress report and today, October 12, 1961.

- 1. Countering Soviet Emploitation of Anti-German Attitudes. The Special Morking Group approved the Agency plans to develop a plausible "Strategic Flam for Germany" to be attributed to a ranking Soviet official for appropriate surfacing to persuade the satellites that Moscow will ignore the interests of Rastern Europe, if this becomes necessary in order to achieve a United Germany under Soviet domination.
- 2. Parentlitary Support Training. The Special Working Group approved the agency proposal to include approximately 50 former nationals of East European satellites in the program.

 The Special Group at its meeting of August 17, 1961 approved the proposal to rescuit and train a limited number of East Garmans for parentlitary support activities.
- 3. Belloon Operations. The agency reports that a review of requirements establishes that only two or four weeks would be required to initiate belloon operations after a decision to start. Consequently, the only preparatory work required at present is the establishment of a small unilateral agency facility which could if required undertake belloon operations toward Rest Germany to supplement black radio. No preparatory action with the three organizations in West Germany capable of bellooming will be taken. The proposal was approved. It is noted that no plans for bellooming from West Berlin are involved and that the Agency has no connections with the recently publicised activities of the SPD.
- Working Group approved the proposal for a 6-hour visit to West Burlin on October 4 by a group of prominent Americans on a trip sponsored by the Free Europe Committee. Commercial air services were used for the trip from Hunich to Berlin and return. The trip took place as scheduled without incident and included a visit to Mast Berlin.
