SUBJECT : Search for FLIM FLAM Sites in the USSR

1. This memorandum is in response to a request for a search of seven general locations for evidence of FLIM FLAM sites.

2. A possible FLIM FLAM site was identified 3.5 nautical miles east of Ulan Ude, USSR, from [REDACTED] photography. This possible site is described in a forthcoming brief, NPIC/B-6/61, Possible FLIM FLAM Site No 2, Ulan Ude, USSR, Jul 61 (TS [REDACTED]).

3. A scan of Missions [REDACTED] produced no positive information concerning FLIM FLAM sites at the other six general locations (Khutor, Paratunka, Crimea, Yeniseysk, Shadrinsk/Omsk, and Kolpashevo/Vershina-Verkhnyaya Vol'dzha). However, verification or denial of the existence of FLIM FLAM sites at these

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locations was precluded by lack of complete photographic coverage
and/or diverse atmospheric conditions.
