- a. Your Freedom of Information Act request of April 18, 2001, for records pertaining to East Germany Intelligence Services Facilities, ZF300207W (our case #799F-01).
- b. Our letter of January 9, 2006, informing you we were unable to comply with the 20-day statutory time limit in processing your request (our case #118F-06).
- c. Our letters of March 27, 2006 and September 15, 2006, informing you we were still reviewing the records you requested and would respond to you once the review had been completed (our case #118F-06).

We have conducted checks of the automated Defense Central Index of Investigations and a search of the Investigative Records Repository to determine the existence of Army intelligence investigative records responsive to your request. We have located records pertaining to your request on East Germany Intelligence Services Facilities, ZF300207W.

We have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance with Executive Order (EO) 12958, as amended. As a result of our review, information has been sanitized and 226 pages of records are denied in their entirety as the information is currently and properly classified SECRET and CONFIDENTIAL according to Sections 1.2(a)(2), 1.2(a)(3) and 1.4(c) of EO 12958, as amended. This information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552(b)(1). It is not possible to reasonably segregate meaningful portions of the withheld pages for release. The records are enclosed for your use. A brief explanation of the applicable sections follows:

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2. (C) Description (See Figure 1)

The MFS site was at US137924, in the NW section of LEIPZIG, immediately N of the Hans Driesch Strasse, 50 m W of the Rivulet, "Bauerngraben" and 50 m E of the Otto Schmiedt Strasse. It was 100 m long on the E side. A steel rod fence, two m high, secured the area on the S side. The other sides were enclosed behind a three m high brick wall. The steel rod double leaf gate hinged to brick gate posts, adjoined on the W by a pedestrian gate, was situated in the middle of the S side. The pedestrian gate was adjoined by a single story brick guard house, five x three m aligned E-W, with a low pitched gable roof. Three m wide driveway, shaped roughly in the form of a question mark, led to a three story brick building with an ornamental facade, built on an elevation, 50 m N of the Hans Driesch Strasse, and in the middle section of the area. 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referred to by the population as the "Maedler Villa". An unknown number of barely visible buildings, surrounded by a brick wall, were N of the "Maedler Villa". The brick wall around the buildings was illuminated at night. Whenever Source passed by, he usually observed through the window of the guard house a guard on duty either wearing a bluish uniform or civilian attire. Even though there were no obvious signs or other indications of the true nature of this site, it was common knowledge among the population that political prisoners were detained and interrogated here by the MFS.

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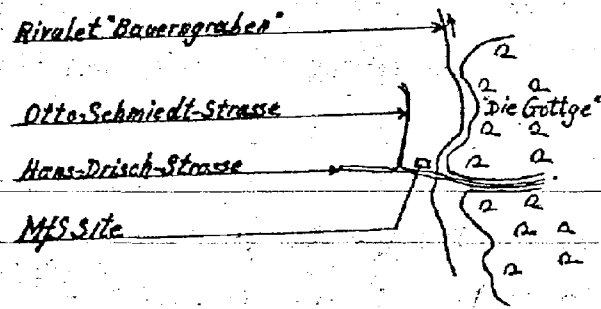
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Figure (C) LEIPZIG (5110M-12205)(U1489), Location Overlay to MIS Site

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
