References:

a. Your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of March 29, 2001, for records concerning various dossiers. Your request was received in this office on April 18, 2001.

b. Our letter of April 20, 2001, informing you that additional time was needed to review the records and we were unable to comply with the 20-day statutory time limit in processing your request. The records are enclosed for your use.

We have conducted checks of the automated Defense Clearance and Investigations Index and a search of the Investigative Records Repository to determine the existence of Army intelligence investigative records responsive to your request. The records are enclosed for your use.

We have located the enclosed records pertaining to Belgium Intelligence Services, ZF400010W. We have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance with Executive Order (EO) 12958. As a result of our review, information has been sanitized and 16 pages of records are denied in their entirety as the information is currently and properly classified SECRET and CONFIDENTIAL according to Sections 1.3(a)(2), 1.3(a)(3), 3.4(b)(1) and 3.4(b)(6) of EO 12958. This information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552(b)(1). It is not possible to reasonably segregate meaningful portions of the withheld pages for release. A brief explanation of the applicable sections follows:

Section 1.3(a)(2) of EO 12958 provides that information shall be classified SECRET if its unauthorized disclosure reasonably could be expected to cause serious damage to the national security.

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Section 1.3.(a)(3) of EO 12958 provides that information shall be classified CONFIDENTIAL if its unauthorized disclosure reasonably could be expected to cause damage to the national security.

Section 3.4(b)(1) of EO 12958 provides that classified information more than 25 years old is exempt from automatic declassification if it would reveal the identity of a confidential human source, or reveal information about the application of an intelligence source or method or reveal the identity of a human intelligence source when the unauthorized disclosure of the source would clearly and demonstrably damage the national security interests of the United States.

Section 3.4(b)(6) of EO 12958 provides that classified information more than 25 years old is exempt from automatic declassification if it would reveal information that would seriously and demonstrably impair relations between the United States and a foreign government, or seriously and demonstrably undermine ingoing diplomatic activities of the United States.

Information has been sanitized from the records and one of the same pages withheld under (b)(1) and one additional page are also denied in their entirety, as the release of the information would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of the individuals concerned, this information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA per Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(6).

In addition, information has been sanitized from the records and three pages of the same pages withheld under (b)(1) and two additional pages are also denied in their entirety as the release of the information would reveal the identity of confidential sources and sensitive intelligence methods. This information is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(7)(D) and (b)(7)(E) of the FOIA. The significant and legitimate governmental purpose to be served by withholding is that a viable and effective intelligence investigative capability is dependent upon protection of confidential sources and sensitive investigative methodologies.

The withholding of information by this office is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Brigadier General Keith B. Alexander, the Commanding General, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You may appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. If you wish to file an appeal, you should forward it to this office. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 60 day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you filing litigation in the courts.

We have been informed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that the information bracketed in black is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(1) of the FOIA.

The withholding of the information by the FBI constitutes a partial denial of your request and you have the right to appeal this decision. If you decide to file an appeal, it should be forwarded to the following: Co-Director, Office of Information and Privacy, U.S. Department of Justice, Flag Building, Suite 570, Washington, DC 20530-0001 within 60 days from the date of this letter. The envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal" or Information Appeal". Please cite FBI/PA #436628 assigned to your request so that it may be easily identified.

Coordination has also been completed and we have been informed by the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) that 43 pages are denied in their entirety pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(1) of the FOIA. It is not possible to reasonably segregate meaningful portions of the withheld pages for release.

The withholding of the information by the DIA constitutes a denial of your request and you have the right to appeal this decision directly to the DIA. If you decide to file an appeal, it should be forwarded to the Director, Defense Intelligence Agency, ATTN: SVI-1-FOIA, Washington, DC 20340-5100. Please cite DIA #0426-98 assigned to your request so that it may be easily identified.

During the processing of your request, records were disclosed which are under the purview of other government agencies. This office has no authority to release these records and they are being referred, along with your request, for appropriate action under the FOIA, and direct reply to you.

In addition, we are coordinating with another government agency concerning the releasability of the information contained in their records. We will inform you as to the releasability of the information upon completion of our coordination.

The amount for professional review and reproduction of the first one hundred pages has been waived. The reproduction cost of \$16.50 remains due and should be forwarded by postal money order or certified check made payable to the Treasurer of the United States.

We are continuing to review records regarding other titles you have requested and will respond to you by separate correspondence when our review is complete.

22. (C/NOFORN/NNINTEL) (u) THE FOLLOWING INITIAL DETAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED REGARDING A RECENT EGHIS CASE IN NL:

A. (C/NOFORN/NNINTEL) (u) ON 24 AUGUST 1979, TWO DUTCH CUSTOMS OFFICERS SAW A SUSPICIOUS MAN BEHAVING STRANGELY AND TAKING PHOTOGRAPHS NEAR THE BORDER BETWEEN THE NETHERLANDS (NL) AND THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY (FRG) EAST/SOUTHEAST OF VENLO, NL. THE TWO CUSTOMS OFFICERS APPROACHED THE MAN TO QUESTION HIM AND, BECAUSE HE SEEMED NERVOUS, THEY DECIDED TO TAKE HIM TO A ROYAL MARECHAUSSEE (MILITARY POLICE) STATION BY VEHICLE. ON THE WAY TO THE MARECHAUSSEE, THE MAN TOOK A ROLL OF FILM OUT OF HIS POCKET AND DELIBERATELY PULLED THE FILM OUT OF THE CARTRIDGE TO EXPOSE IT. SINCE THE MAN HAD BEEN SEEN PHOTOGRAPHING AND OBSERVING A STORAGE FACILITY UNDER CONSIDERATION FOR FUTURE USE AS A COMBAT EQUIPMENT STORAGE SITE BY THE US ARMY NEAR VENLO, NL, THE ROYAL NETHERLANDS ARMY COUNTERINTELLIGENCE (RNA/CI) INVESTIGATORS ENTERED THE CASE AND SUBSEQUENTLY INTERROGATED THE SUSPECT.

B. (C/NOFORN/NNINTEL) (u) THE SUSPECT HAD A WEST GERMAN PERSONAL-AUSWEIS (IDENTITY CARD) WHICH IDENTIFIED HIM AS [REDACTED] (NFI), A CITIZEN OF WEST BERLIN. HE INITIALLY TOLD A FALSE COVER STORY THAT HE WAS A WEST GERMAN TOURIST ON HOLIDAYS IN NL AND TRYING TO FIND THE GRAVE OF HIS FATHER WHO DIES IN THAT AREA OF NL DURING THE WAR.

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A SEARCH OF HIS PERSONAL BELONGINGS REVEALED THAT HE HAD MADE A SMALL SKETCH, RUDDIMENTARY IN NATURE, OF THE BUILDINGS AND DIAGRAM OF A MILITARY EQUIPMENT STORAGE SITE NEAR DEURNE, NL, CURRENTLY BEING USED BY THE BUNDESWEHR (WEST GERMAN ARMY) AND WHICH IS BEING PROJECTED FOR POSSIBLE USE AS A STORAGE SITE BY THE US ARMY EUROPE (USAREUR). FURTHER INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE SUSPECT HAD ALSO TAKEN PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE SITE NEAR DEURNE AND OF A SIMILAR SITE NEAR LIESSEL, NL, SOUTH OF DEURNE.

C. (U) (C/NORFORN/NNINTEL) A TRACE OF THE ID CARD ON [REDACTED] IN WEST BERLIN REVEALED THAT THE REAL [REDACTED] AND HIS WIFE WERE ON HOLIDAYS IN MAJORCA. PHOTOGRAPHS AND DESCRIPTION OF THE REAL [REDACTED] BY HIS DAUGHTER VERIFIED HE WAS NOT THE SAME MAN INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT IN NL. ACCORDING TO RNA/CI, IT WAS FURTHER INDICATED BY PRG AUTHORITIES THAT THE USE OF THE NAMES AND IDENTIFICATION PAPERS OF WEST GERMANS ON HOLIDAYS IN MAJORCA WAS A KNOWN EGIS MODUS OPERANDI (NFI). D. (U) (C/NORFORN/NNINTEL) FURTHER RNA/CI INTERROGATION OF THE SUSPECT REVEALED THAT HE ONLY HAD A SINGLE SHALLOW COVER STORY. HE WAS ALSO NERVOUS AND AGITATED DURING THE INTERROGATION AND EVENTUALLY ADMITTED HIS REAL NAME WAS [REDACTED] THAT HE WAS BORN IN 1937 IN GERMANY, AND THAT HE CURRENTLY RESIDED IN OBERNHAUS, GERMAN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC (GDR) WHERE HE WAS EMPLOYED AS A HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER. [REDACTED] ESSENTIALLY STATED THAT HE WAS APPROACHED BY EAST GERMAN OFFICIALS IN EAST BERLIN WHO ASKED HIM TO COOPERATE WITH AND DO CERTAIN THINGS FOR THEM WHEN HE WAS IN NL. ACCORDING TO RNA/CI, THE ADDRESS [REDACTED] GAVE IN EAST BERLIN WHERE THESE OFFICIALS TOOK HIM IS A KNOWN EGIS ADDRESS. [REDACTED] AGREED TO COOPERATE AND HE WAS GIVEN A FALSE ID CARD, A COVER STORY, AND SOME TRAINING IN PHOTOGRAPHY, OBSERVATION AND SKETCHING. [REDACTED] REPORTEDLY TRAVELED FROM EAST BERLIN TO COPENHAGEN, DENMARK, AND FROM COPENHAGEN TO AMSTERDAM, NL. Approximately three (3) weeks before this incident, Mr. (b)(6) also asked this agent to assist in locating the divorced wife of a Russian national (name unknown), who allegedly operates a small printing establishment in MUNICH, and at this time also stated that the Belgian Government wanted the woman for questioning concerning her activities as a Russian Agent. (F-3)

2. On both instances, Mr. (b)(6) was referred to Headquarters, 66th CIC Group, STUTTGART 32UNV10, Germany, and Intelligence Division in HEIDELBERG 32UMV77 Germany, as being the proper places to direct his requests for assistance. On each occasion he stated that the desired information was not of great enough importance for him to contact either of the two (2) above mentioned units. On a later date, he did make a notation of the mailing address of CIC Headquarters in STUTTGART, stating that he might write on the stationery of the ICEM, and request the desired information. (F-4)

3. Mr. (b)(6) has been a casual business contact of this agent for a period of approximately ten (10) months, during which time he has frequently stated that he, in connection with his employment, has diplomatic immunity and is of consular rank. He carries in his possession a German identification certificate issued to diplomats of foreign countries, which from its appearance, is seemingly authentic. He also displays the Consular Corps "CC" emblem affixed to his private vehicle, a 1949 American Ford Tudor sedan, dark green in color, which he recently purchased from an American Army Sergeant. Mr. (b)(6) is married and has one (1) male child, approximately two (2) years of age. He resides with his family in Funk Kaserne. His hobby is photography, about which he seems to know a great deal. He apparently has very little money and has stated that he feels that both he and his country are being discriminated against by the United States Occupation Authorities in Germany because he is not allowed Post Exchanges and Commissary privileges and is not furnished United States Army requisitioned housing. 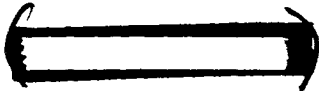

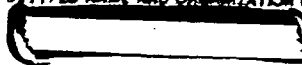

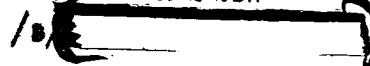

I am the son of blacksmith \_\_\_\_\_ and his wife \_\_\_\_\_ nee \_\_\_\_\_ After completing 8 years of elementary school and one year of high school in Weimar I learned the trade of a scene-painter (theater). I completed my apprenticeship receiving a diploma, and on 1-8-51 I was drafted to the police, Kreis Police Office Weimar, to serve the minimum time of 3 years.

During the first two weeks I pulled duty at a Weimar police precinct station. I was given 3 days instruction and was then ordered to pull duty together with an older policeman. The 3 days of theoretical training concerned only police matters. I was also trained in the use of the carbi 98 k and pistol 08 (Luger). Approx. two weeks after having joined the police I was transferred to Gruppenposten (Village police station) in Nohra. I remained there until December 1951.

At the police station of the village of Nohra I was trained twice a week for a full day in theory, including pistol 08. After the first three weeks with this station which is under the jurisdiction of the Kreis Police Weimar, my training was reduced to one day a week. Although the training was not completed yet, I was pulling single patrol duty in a district of Weimar. If I came across problems for which I did not have the required knowledge as a policeman, I solved them with my common sense. I had to make two types of reports daily: Entering all incidents in the police blotter, and making up daily reports to the station.

Starting in September 1951 I carried a pistol 08 while on duty.

The following regulations covered the use of firearms:

If a person attempted to escape while identity papers were checked, it was up to the policeman to decide whether or not to use the firearm. In the case of escaping criminals firearms had to be used. In the case of escaping ~~if~~ offenders of minor violations the use of firearms was prohibited. In the case of escapees who were suspected that they would during the further course of their flight escape from the territory of the DDR, it was again up to the policeman to decide about use of firearms. But only if no innocent persons would be endangered. Reports had to be forwarded concerning each use of ammunition. Each policeman had 8 rounds with him.

In December 1951 I was transferred to the so-called Schnellkommando of the Kreis Police Weimar (riot squad). I was in that unit until 31-3-52. The riot squad had three shifts, one was on duty, the second on stand-by, and the third was off. The riot squad was billeted in kasernes. During the time off the policemen were allowed to go home and sleep at home, too. The arms were carbine 98 k, pistol 08, rubber stick and chain. The strength of the squad during the time I was there, was 1 Kommissar and 15 men; one shift had one sergeant and 4 men. During the time I served with that unit, it was used for ~~entirely for~~ police matters only.

I lived in [redacted] in East Prussia with my parents until October 1944. My father is [redacted] and my mother [redacted] nee [redacted]. I attended elementary school for eight years. In October 1944 we fled before the advancing Russians and came to [redacted]. In May 1945 the Russians arrived there, too. Because my father refused to give them his horses, they shot him. Later I worked for farmers. In 1950 I was told to join the FDGB. I refused first, but later had to join it. The same with the FDJ. I wanted to learn the profession of a seamstress, but was told I had to join the FDJ to get a place to work. So I did, but I still had to continue working for farmers as I did not get a place to learn seamstress. In November 1952 I and several other girls were told by the FDJ to volunteer for the female VOPO, otherwise they would draft us. I refused to volunteer together with several other girls. On 13-12-52 I and the other girls who had refused to volunteer received a letter ordering us to report to the Kreis Headquarters to join the female VOPO. This time we had to obey. We were taken to a camp of the VOPO in Magdeburg-Sudenburg. The camp can take about 200 persons. There are 4 barracks there, 2 for quarters, 1 for messhall, kitchen and canteen, and another one for classes and rooms for the leaders. We were told that we had to serve in the VOPO to defend our country against the Western Imperialists. But they did not tell us, how long we would have to stay in or what we would have to do later. They finally told us we would be trained for about one year. What would come later, they did not say. The camp had 200 girls, from my home county there were 35 who had been drafted and 15 who had volunteered. There was one camp leader (woman), and two girl leaders for each of the 4 groups. Each group had 50 girls. There were also some leaders for administration and the offices. The leader of each group had a silver lined epaulet with two stars, the second leader of each group the same epaulet with one star. The camp was located outside of Magdeburg, about 30 minutes to walk from the city. Streetcars 6 and 12 were going out there. The name of the camp was: Volkspolizeiausbildungslager Magdeburg-Sudenburg (People's Police Training Camp of Magdeburg-Sudenburg). They told us that our basic training would be 3 months. I only took 8 weeks and then fled.

On our first day we received the blue VOPO uniform, consisting of jacket, trousers, cap (so-called ski-cap), blue shirt, red necktie, long boots for duty and low shoes for off duty.

During the first week we had political schooling, from 7-11 and 13-17.

2nd week: Training with carbine 98 k and political schooling.

The parts of the carbine and its care.

3rd week: Training with carbine outside, on the training ground. We marched down in formation. The different positions in firing, and at the end firing 4 rounds from a lying position at a target (figure) at a distance of 10 m.

4th week: Same training.

5th to 8th week: No changes in training. 186

9th week: Training with machine gun was scheduled, but at that time I had already fled from the camp. Together with seven other girls I fled on 14-2-53.

I pulled my duty in the VOPO very reluctantly, and I would have never joined it without having been forced. Some of the girls with whom I fled had



leave, I was one of them. For the other girls we took civilian clothes out, and they joined us later outside the camp. We crossed the zone border near Strelow (East zone) and Schnackenburg (West zone, Dannenberg area) without having seen a patrol of the East zone border police. That means we first made sure that there was no patrol at all. I did not see any 10 m control stripe or barbed wire fences.

Concerning the strength of the VOPO in Magdeburg and of the Russian occupation troops I can tell but little. There is VOPO in Magdeburg since a long time, also in kasernes. I also saw many Border Police, who wear a silver "G" on their left sleeves.


The Russian troops I have seen in Magdeburg had epaulets with blue lining, such with black lining around the edges, and other had plain red epaulets with red insignias on the collars. The latter were tank troops. They moved to Magdeburg early in February with 25 light tanks. I believe they come from Russia, we judged that from their uniforms. We have observed that Russian troops coming to Germany receive new uniforms before being transferred to Germany.

The reason for my flight is that I am against the system in the East zone and can be no friend with a state whose soldiers shot my father before my eyes in 1945. I had been repeatedly been noticed due to the fact that I refused to join political organizations, as the FDJ, FDGB, Society for German-Soviet Friendship. And with the VOPO I had to pull a type of duty which is against my nature as a woman, and furthermore I did not even know how long that duty would last, and where and how I would have to pull it.

In March 1952 I volunteered for the Border Police and was transferred to the Border Police Headquarters Muehlhausen (Grenzpolizeibereitschaft). That was a headquarters comparable to an army regiment's headquarters. There were 30 officers, 40 non-commissioned officers and 25 to 30 enlisted men for guard duty. In the non-commissioned officers' school which was attached to the headquarters, there were 2 officers, 3 non-commissioned officers and 30 trainees.

The ~~NK~~ NCO school was in the same building and trained only personnel of the area of the headquarters Muehlhausen. NCO's and privates were trained for NCO's positions. To attend the school, one had to have one year in service. In charge of the school was an Oberleutnant (1st Lt), I believe he was a former Wehrmacht officer. Under him were a younger Unterleutnant (2nd Lt) and three NCO's as group leaders. The pupils were given a complete infantry and combat training (as group leaders) and also training in street fights (as police group leaders. They were also trained in combat engineering, but only theoretically. In the infantry training at the school, only Russian weapons were used: carbine M 44 (K 100), LP (machine pistol) LP 100, light machine gun LMG 100, and a Russian bazooka. The training was made in accordance with Russian regulations and even the commands were translated from Russian into German. The course which I saw there being trained in January 1953, had started in April 1952. It was supposed to be completed in summer 1953. I believe the school leader's name was Oberleutnant KOCH. Special value was placed upon political training and schooling.

In April 1952 I was transferred to the Kommandantur (sub-area headquarter in Geismar, northeast of Eschwege. The sub-headquarters in Geismar includes the staff and a small guard unit. The officers are as follows:

Commander: Oberleutnant (1st Lt) HELBACH  
1st deputy commander: Politoffizier (Polit Officer) Capt/(Hauptmann) HOLI  
2nd deputy commander: Operativoffizier (Operative Officer) Oberleutnant KOHL  
Chief of Staff: Leutnant LUEDECKE  
Liaison officer to SSD: Leutnant BERGER

- 1) Polit Officer: Responsible for political schooling
- 2) Operative Officer: Assistant commander (similar to adjutant)
- 3) Stabschef (chief of staff): In charge of the work of the staff (kind of administrative function)
- 4) SSD Liaison officer: Wears Border Police Uniform, but is a member of the SSD. Surveillance of all personnel. Makes his reports to his higher headquarters. Does not take any action personally, but request action from higher SSD headquarters.

There are other officer's position in the Geismar headquarters, which however are occupied by NCOs due to lack of personnel:

- 1) Supply Officer: Oberfeldwebel (Sfc) BILLY (supply, clothing, food, furniture)
- 2) Interpreter and Liaison officer to the Russians: Oberfeldwebel (Sfc) BAGOTTA.

The Kommandantur (sub-headquarters) Geismar then transferred me to the Kommando (unit) in Grosstoeper, southwest of Geismar where I arrived on 6 April 1952 and remained until 15 May 1952. On 16 May 1952 I was transferred to the unit in Hildebrandshausen southeast of Geismar where I remained until December 1952. Both units come under the jurisdiction of the Kommandatur Geismar. They have the same duty regulations, type of duty and strength. 4 men are in charge of the units: 3 officers and one NCO: Commander of the unit, Operative officer, Polit officer and internal duty leader who is a NONCOM (Hauptfeldwebel - Master Sergeant).

Three more NCO positions belong to a unit headquarters:

- 1) Mess Sergeant; responsible for kitchen, food, furniture of the unit offices, but not responsible for clothing arms and ammunition which are supplied directly by the Bereitschaft (main headquarters).
- 2) Courier
- 3) Horse keeper who is responsible for keeping the 10 m stripe in order for which purpose he is in charge of two horses.

A Kommando (unit) has 5 Einsatzgruppen (squads) with one NCO and 9 men each. That makes 5 NCOs and 45 men available for patrol duty of whom 7 are on leave all the time. So 43 men, including NCOs are actually available at all times. These men guard and patrol the border section to which the unit is assigned (8 to 12 km long on the average).

Patrol Duty: The patrol duty is 8 hours. 4 patrols walk simultaneously for 8 hours. The route is prescribed. Between the sections of two Kommandos (units) the patrol routes overlap for 300 m, the patrols routes of the patrols within the same unit overlap for 100 m. The area to be patrolled by one patrol starts 200 m behind the 10 m stripe and is on the average 2 km long. Twice a day one NCO and one man make a patrol check to check the 10 m stripe. Only these control patrols may enter the 10 m stripe, all other normal patrols must not come closer to the 10 m stripe than 200 m. A violation is an offense to be punished by disciplinary action. If the patrols cross the border they have committed a serious crime. Their violation will be reported to Berlin through channels.

It is strictly prohibited for the patrols to get in contact with member of the West zone border police or of the Western occupation forces. That would be punished with heavy disciplinary action, possibly with exclusion from the VOPO. Since December 1952 there is a regulation out that the Kommando (unit) commander may punish a man with confinement up to 5 days and restriction up to 8 days.

The patrols are further prohibited to make private conversations with any border crossers or other persons while on duty. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders.

Stand by duty: While one third of the Kommando is on patrol duty, the second third is off, and the third third is on stand by duty. That includes 3 hours a week political schooling, 2 hours a week border police instructions, 3 hours a week drill, one hour a week training with weapons, carbines and machine pistol.

The Kommandos are armed as follows:

Officers carry a pistol 08 (Luger), an improved model with 9 mm cal. they carry the weapon at all times. The group leaders carry machine pistol MP 100 with two drums of ammo each, together 142 rounds, the guards carry carbine with 60 rounds.

Border Guarding: All roads leading towards the border, have a movable barrier 5 km from the border. At that point persons are checked as to their identification papers, authorization to enter the 5 km-zone etc. 10 m from the actual border, the roads have a stationary barrier. Directly at the border line, there is a ditch across the roads serving as a trap for motor vehicles and then another stationary barrier. While the 10 m stripe has been ploughed over on the fields and even trees and buildings had to be removed, the 10 m stripe on concrete ground (roads etc) is equipped with a barbed wire fence system. In some sections of our area 50 m long wires were laid out which set off signal flares when touched. I did not observe any observation stands in our section.

Volksarmee (People's Army):

Officially I do not know anything about reorganizing the VOPO into a People's Army. And I do not know, either, if there has any reorganization been started elsewhere. I know plainly that the VOPO which is billeted in kasernes, is actually nothing but an army, in regards to organization as well as to ranks. The only reorganization that was made, was in fall of 1952. The border Police which was called: Grenzpolizei, Abteilung Grenze (Border Police, Department Border) was renamed into: Deutsche Grenzpolizei (German Border Police) and at the same time the border police was put under the jurisdiction of the Ministry for State Security, and SSD liaison officers were detached to border police units. The ranks in the border police were also renamed and are now about the same as the were in the former German army.

SSD: In September 1952, the SSD liaison officer of the Kommandantur Geismar, Lt. BERGER, approached me. The reason was as follows: As I had joined the VOPO as an FDJ member, I received the function of FDJ secretary in the unit Hildebrandshausen. They have an FDJ secretary in each unit headquarters. He has to take care of the FDJ members in the VOPO, hold meetings and make reports to the FDJ secretaries in high VOPO headquarters. Lt. BERGER requested me to do the following:

- 1) make regular written reports concerning the morale within the VOPO, report any planned escapes.
- 2) report all connections of VOPO members to the civilian population, particularly to politically suspicious civilians.



Interpreter School Holzdorf:

This interpreter school in Holzdorf is located approx. 8 km south of Weimar. Officers candidates are being trained there for the People's Army (VOPO in kasernes). Due to the fact that the school is located within the precinct of the police station of Nohra, where I was stationed in 1951, I was able to collect some vague information in regards to the training schedule. Officer candidates there are trained in Russian language and trained in tactical training for all branches of service in Russian language. The purpose is to train a number of interpreters in officers rank for the staffs and headquarters of the People's Army. First for 6 months there is nothing but training in Russian language; then starts the training in tactics, made in Russian language. The whole course takes, as far as I know, 18 months. At one time there were 60 to 80 officer candidates attending one course.

I am the son of office clerk ( ) and his wife ( ) ( )  
I attended an elementary school in BRUMI for four years and then a high school, later in Garmisch I attended an elementary school for another two years. In May 1945 my mother with her children was expelled from Czechoslovakia and came to Kreis Atern to the village of Hauerode. My father is missing since the battle of Stalingrad. In 1947 my mother married again, the ( ) We then moved to Helbrungen. In 1947 I went to learn the trade of a barber, but after one year I was forced to interrupt my apprenticeship, as each firm had to send one man to work for the WISSMUTH Company in an uranium mine at Georgenstadt, Kreis Schwarzenburg. When I returned after one year I could not continue to learn barber, as they had announced a law according to which only women could learn barber. So I was forced to go back to the uranium mine for another year. I joined the FDJ, as otherwise I would have stayed in the lowest wage group all the time. Through the FDJ I was drafted to the Border Police in May 1952.

My basic training was with the GRKPS (Grenzpolizei - Border Police) in Kommandantur (area headquarters) in GERSTUNGEN from June until fall 1952. The course had 40 to 50 men. They always had only one course as a class. Then came a break of four weeks, and after that another course. The personnel had time off during the breaks. The basic training was divided into three parts: physical training, political training and technical training. The physical training was only between 1952 and 1953.

First week: Political schooling only.

Teacher was a Politbureau member, who was from the KPD Headquarters (Headquarters) BREMEN, south of Bad Salzwungen. Main subjects of the schooling were: History of the Russian KPD, of the laborers' movement in Germany, especially of the KPD, SPD and SED, German history after 1945 until now and then STALIN's books and works.

Second Week: Border Police Training, to include carbine 98 k.

The training also included how to act against border crossers, the acting on the 10 m stripe, in the 500 m protectional zone and in the 5 km zone; the laws concerning use of weapons, arrest and search, checking of identification and passes.

Persons who were within the 10 m stripe were to be shot at without warning, immediately. That is a must. Persons in the 500 m zone who are on the main roads will be arrested. Persons who live in the 500 m zone must be in possession of a pass. Persons in the 500 m zone who are off the main roads, on side roads, on in the open field, will be called at: Halt stehen bleiben - Grenzschutz - Haende hoch. (Halt, Border Police, hands up). If the persons does not obey, one warning shot will be fired, if the person still keeps running, then an aimed shot will be fired. After 2200 hrs noone is allowed in the 500 m zone, also not even those who live there.

In the section of the SALLMANNSHAUSEN unit where I was stationed, only "reliable" persons were allowed to remain and live in the 500 m zone. All the others had been evacuated into the interior of the East zone by end of May 1952.

Within the 5 km zone all persons were to be arrested who were not in possession of the proper pass. Also all persons were to be arrested who resisted when their papers were being checked. The use of firearms was allowed in the 5 km zone only in the case of resistance.

All the villages and towns in the 5 km zone were to be searched for persons who were not in possession of the proper pass.



3rd week: Infantry training. In groups early, firing positions with carbine, digging fox holes. Use of compass, 2 to 3 hours political training a week.

4th week: Same duty as in the 3rd week, in addition practice firing 3 rounds, distance 100 m, and 200 m, position lying.

At the end of the course there was an examination held by a Russian officer in GREPO uniform and by the Chief of the GREPO Kommandantur. I recognized one officer to be Russian because of his broken German with Russian accent.

In July I then came to the active Border Police for duty and was transferred to the Kommando SALLMANSHAUSEN.

The headquarters of this Kommando consisted of the following:

Kommando (unit) commander: Leutnant HORN

Polit Officer Oberfeldwebel (Sfc) KOHL

Operative Officer Unterleutnant (2nd Lt) DRESCHER

In charge of internal duty  
(Sergeant Major) Feldwebel (Sgt) TEUERKAUF

In addition there were 5 Noncom's as group leaders of the patrols and one "dog leader" who was a Pfc (Gefreiter).

Until January 1953 they had a kitchen sergeant, but then this position was taken care of by the Internal Duty Leader (Innendienstleiter - Sergeant Major).

The unit headquarters further included a courier with motorcycle and a horse keeper, both privates. The horse keeper had two horses with which he had to take care of the 10 m stripe which had a length of 25 km in the SALLMANSHAUSEN unit.

The Kommando was divided into 5 groups. Their strength was each 1 Cpl and 9 men. On leave were always approx. 3 men.

Until December 1952 the Kommando was divided into three shifts: Patrols duty, standby duty and one shift off. But this system had the disadvantage that the population found out about the times when shifts were relieved, and so had occasion to easily cross the border.

Therefore a new system was applied in which the patrols were not relieved all at the same time. Now there are always 10 to 12 patrols out, each 2 men, they are on duty 8 hours. After their patrol the men are on standby duty 8 hours, and then are off for 8 hours.

The patrol routes are strictly prescribed and do not come closer than 100 m to the 10 m control stripe. The patrol routes in our Kommando did not overlap. Each patrol had orders not to enter the patrol route of the adjoining patrol. Entering the 10 m stripe was a punishable offense. The following punishments could be announced: Verbal reprimand, written reprimand, (these reprimands had two classes: Verwarnung is a minor reprimand, Verweis is a stronger reprimand); then there were a severe verbal reprimand, a severe written reprimand, restriction up to 8 days, slight confinement up to 8 days, and hard confinement up to 5 days. If a patrol enters the 10 m stripe, their names are reported to the ~~KEKKE~~ VOPO Bereitschaft (Headquarters) which then turns them over to court. It also strictly prohibited to talk to members of the western occupation forces or of the Bundesgrenzschutz (Federal Border Police) or to contact them in any way. Such offense is punished the first time with a severe written reprimand, the second time with hard confinement. The third time the offender is turned over to the VOPO Bereitschaft for punishment.

kept the film; however, on 29 September 1952, a member of the KPD Landes-  
leitung (State Headquarters) called on me and asked for the film. I refused  
to give him the film as I was afraid of being accused of espionage.

b. Question - What do you know about requisitions by the Belgian "occupation forces," the Military, and other installations of the Belgian Army, for instance, firing ranges, maneuver fields, etc.?

Answer - The first information I received concerning the Belgian occupation forces in Northern Hesse was obtained in June 1952 from the daily newspapers "Kasseler Post," "Hessische Nachrichten," and "Kasseler Zeitung." After arriving in KASSEL I heard from NPD members about the building of large barracks for Belgian Tank Companies at the Doenche, Eugen Richter Strasse, in KASSEL. I was also informed about the building of a large number of houses for the families of the Belgian soldiers, where previously garden tracts were located. An article also appeared in the "Haldeckschen Landeszeitung" (Haldeck State Newspaper) about the drill ground for Belgian tanks. All this was consolidated and reported to the SVC in FRANKFURT/M. Also, all reports concerning the NATO maneuvers in North Hesse were prepared, without exception, according to the reports of the "Kasseler Post," "Hessische Nachrichten," and the "Kasseler Zeitung."

c. Question - Did you ever stay in the Soviet Zone of Germany?

Answer -

After arriving there, I submitted an application for admission to study at the Humboldt University in East BERLIN. For two (2) years, I studied Philosophy and History at the Humboldt University and later at the Jena University. The professor in charge of the Jena University was Professor (FNU) who had to give up his position in 1948 because he was seriously attacked by the Communist "Volksbildungsministerium" (Ministry for Education). He is presently teaching at the Free University in BERLIN/Leiden.

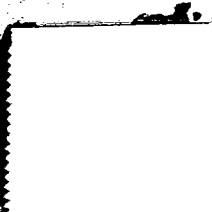

While on German territory, this manhunt was executed by the LSHR police and occupiers; searches of the private homes of GLAPIAN and AVER families completed the dishonorable spectacle. Under the pretext of searching for their own product of imagination, "Operation Cherusker," German and Belgian police broke into homes during the night applying force and destroying apartment furniture, and robbed a private library. "Operation Cherusker" - The largest large scale provocation of the LHM Police against the Peace Movement and the KPD - The occupiers on mainland, Gestapo methods back again. In the northern part of your country, which is to be stripped of all industry in accordance with the Contractual Agreement and which is to be the theatre of operation for the dollar strategists, events have occurred prior to the arrival of "Korean Specialist" J. F. DULLES, which show very plainly the degree of turning Western Germany into a fascist country. Manhunt for decent German patriots, arrests and kidnapping of laborers and functionaries, and brutal searches of homes at night are methods which have already marked the beginning of an era of disaster for Germany. On the following Sunday, 1 February 1953, she was again arrested and interrogated by ROGOWSKI for five (5) hours, during which time she was brutally beaten by ROGOWSKI. GLAPIAK was then turned over to the police of the Belgian occupation forces. At the same time, Ferdinand MUE, a member of the Kreis Kassel KPD Headquarters who is an old Communist and a well known peace fighter, was arrested by order of the Belgian occupiers and kidnapped. The reason for this arrest was the search for "Operation Cherusker" which exists only in the imagination of the police.
