References:

a. Your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of March 29, 2001, for records concerning various dossiers. Your request was received in this office on April 18, 2001.

b. Our letter of April 20, 2001, informing you that additional time was needed to review the records and we were unable to comply with the 20-day statutory time limit in processing your request.

We have conducted checks of the automated Defense Clearance and Investigations Index and a search of the Investigative Records Repository to determine the existence of Army intelligence investigative records responsive to your request.

We have located the enclosed records pertaining to Czechoslovakia Embassy, Washington, DC, ZF010716W. We have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance with Executive Order 12958. As a result of this review, it has been determined that the Army-originated information no longer warrants security classification protection and is partially releasable to you. The records are enclosed for your use. Fees for processing this request are waived.

This material has been sanitized to remove the names of operational personnel that would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of the individuals concerned. This information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA per Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(6).

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The withholding of information by this office is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Brigadier General Keith B. Alexander, the Commanding General, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You may appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. If you wish to file an appeal, you should forward it to this office. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 60 day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you filing litigation in the courts.

We have been informed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that their review disclosed that information has been sanitized and nine pages are denied in their entirety as the information is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(7)(C) and (b)(7)(D) of the FOIA. To aid you in identifying the FBI exempted information we have bracketed it in black. It is not possible to reasonably segregate meaningful portions of the withheld pages for release.

The withholding of the information by the FBI constitutes a partial denial of your request and you have the right to appeal this decision. If you decide to file an appeal, it should be forwarded to the following: Co-Director, Office of Information and Privacy, U.S. Department of Justice, Flag Building, Suite 570, Washington, DC 20530-0001 with 60 days from the date of this letter. The envelope and the letter should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Appeal" or "Information Appeal". Please cite FBI FOI/PA #441835 assigned to your request so that it may be easily identified.

During the processing of your request, information was disclosed which is under the purview of other government agencies. This office has no authority to release these records and they are being referred, along with your request, for appropriate action under the FOIA, and direct reply to you.

We are continuing to review other titles you have requested and will respond to you by separate correspondence when our review is complete.

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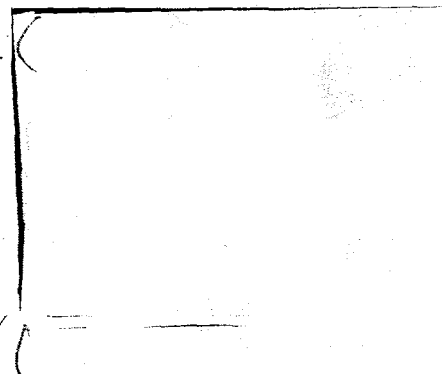

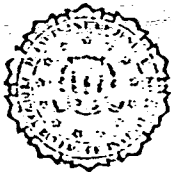

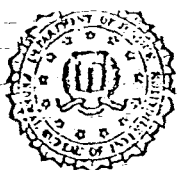

(C/NFD) On 19 April 1973, at about 1130 hours, Subject presented himself to Source after having visited the Press Room in the Pentagon. He had a roll of printed papers in his hand. Source noted that the papers in Subject's hand were the News Release sheets that were obtainable in the press room to anyone who had access to the room. Subject stopped to ask if Source was able to obtain the latest issue of the Army Reserve Magazine for him. Source had not seen the April issue of the magazine but would get one for him. Source volunteered the information that there was to be a display by the US Army Reserves in the concourse to celebrate their 65th Anniversary. Subject did not appear to be interested and reiterated his request for the ARM. Subject then informed Source that he was departing for Czechoslovakia for a period of six weeks beginning in June. Upon being asked by Source when he was last in Czechoslovakia, Subject replied that he had been away

for two years. Subject further stated that his children were here to visit him last year. When queried, Subject said also that he had a boy and a girl, the older child being 20 years old.

Subject then asked Source if her birthday was not soon. Source told him that it was in September. Whereupon Subject remarked that he would remember and present Source with an appropriate gift such as a bottle of liquor or something. Subject left the Pentagon at about 1150 hours.

COMMENT: Subject has been observed making appearances once weekly for the last five weeks and has indicated that he will continue to appear weekly for the express purpose of obtaining the Press Releases from the Press Room.

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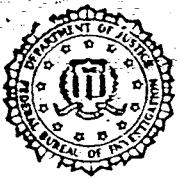
