References:

a. Your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of March 29, 2001, for records concerning various dossiers. Your request was received in this office on May 7, 2001.

b. Our letter of April 20, 2001, informing you that additional time was needed to review the records and we were unable to comply to the 20-day statutory time limit in processing your request.

We have conducted checks of the automated Defense Clearance and Investigations Index and a search of the Investigative Records Repository to determine the existence of Army intelligence investigative records responsive to your request.

We have located the enclosed record pertaining to North Korea Subversive Activities, ZF004017W. We have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance, with Executive Order 12958. As a result of this review, it has been determined that the information no longer warrants security classification protection and is partially releasable to you. Fees for processing this request are waived.

Since the release of some of the information deleted from the records would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of the individuals concerned, this information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA per Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C).


The withholding of information by this office is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Brigadier General Keith B. Alexander, the Commanding General, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You may appeal this decision to the

Secretary of the Army. If you wish to file an appeal, you should forward it to this office. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 60 day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you filing litigation in the courts.

We are continuing to process your request for records regarding other titles and will respond to you by separate correspondence when our action is complete.

4. REPORT OF FINDINGS

(INTERVIEW) On 22 January 1981, L MAJ, (L)
Tactics Division, Command Management, US Army Air Defense School, Ft Bliss,
Texas 79916, was interviewed concerning his knowledge of propaganda material
obtained in the Republic of Korea. L stated substantially as follows:

L had served in Fort Bragg, North Carolina (NC) as a Psychological
Operations (PSYOPS) Officer in the European PSYOPS Battalion and had worked
with Communist/Socialist propaganda as part of his job. L then
reassigned to the Republic of Korea (ROK) as the Range Officer, Sea Range, 38th
Air Defense Artillery. In September 1979, the 2d Battalion, 61st Chaparral/
Vulcan Artillery, 2d Infantry Division, were at Sea Range for their semi-annual
range firing. During this time, L learned from some 2/61st officers of
some North Korean propaganda material being distributed in the 2d Infantry Divi-
sion area. Since L had worked with propaganda material before, he asked
if some of this material could be brought for him on the 2/61st's next range
firing mission. In approximately February 1980, the 2/61st returned to Sea
Range and the publications were brought to him. Not knowing how to read Korean,
L asked E (FNU), a translator with Sea Range, 38th ADA, to translate
the material. E had replied that it was "No 10 stuff" and did not trans-
late it. L took no further action with the publications and had left
them in a bookcase in his office. L had hoped the material would be leaf-
lets in lieu of publications which he had intended to sent back to the Asian
PSYOPS Battalion in Ft Bragg, NC., however, he felt the material was probably too
detailed to be of any use.
