References:

a. Your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of March 29, 2001, for records concerning Somalia Intelligence Services, ZF400104W. Your request was received in this office on April 18, 2001.

b. Our letter of April 20, 2001, informing you that additional time was needed to review the records and we were unable to comply to the 20-day statutory time limit in processing your request.

We have conducted checks of the automated Defense Clearance and Investigations Index and a search of the Investigative Records Repository to determine the existence of Army intelligence investigative records responsive to your request.

We have located the enclosed records pertaining to Somalia Intelligence Services, ZF400104W. We have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance with Executive Order 12958. As a result of this review, it has been determined that the Army-originated information no longer warrants security classification protection and is partially releasable to you. The records are enclosed for your use. Fees for processing this request are waived.

Since the release of the information deleted from the records would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy right of the individuals concerned, this information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA per Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(7)(C).


In addition, since the release of the information would reveal the identity of confidential sources, it is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(7)(D) of the FOIA. The significant and legitimate governmental purpose to be served by withholding is that a viable and effective intelligence investigative capability is dependent upon protection of confidential sources.

The withholding of information by this office is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Brigadier General Keith B. Alexander, the Commanding General, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You may appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. If you wish to file an appeal, you should forward it to this office. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 60 day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you filing litigation in the courts.

We are continuing to process your request for records regarding other titles and will respond to you by separate correspondence when our action is complete.

On 14 September 1982, [redacted] GS-11, Quality Assurance Specialist (QAS), Team Chief, Foreign Military Sales, Product Assurance Directorate, US Army Missile Command (MICOM), Redstone Arsenal (RSA), Alabama 35809, reported that during the period 29 August - 8 September 1982, he made a trip to Mogadishu, Somalia as a part of a Quality Assurance Team. The team was comprised of himself; [redacted] QAS, Product Assurance Directorate, New Cumberland Army Depot, New Cumberland, PA; [redacted] Mechanic (Vehicles), Red River Army Depot, Texarkana, TX; [redacted] QAS, Metrology, Anniston Army Depot, Anniston, AL; and [redacted] QAS (Vehicles), Tank and Automotive Command (TACOM), Warren, MI. The purpose of the trip included the inventory and set-up of 24 TOW missile equipped M-113 Armored Personnel Carriers furnished by

the US to the Somalian Government. On 30 August 1982, [] met an unidentified male, Somalian or Etheopian, later identified as [] on the beach while taking a walk. [] claimed to be an English teacher, and an association ensued between [] and []. Their association lasted from 30 August to 5 September 1982, at which time [] departed Somalia. During their period of association, [] spent quite abit of time with [] and had him over to the QAS team house on three or four occasions. On one occasion, [] overheard a conversation between [] and [] during which [] described in detail his travels for the US Government in the Middle East; his past assignments; and present reason for being in Somalia. [] was suspicious of [] and obtained a photograph of [] and [] in [] room while they were sitting on [] bed (EXHIBIT I). [] repeatedly asked for any material written in English for his English class. [] advised [] not to associate with [] but [] disregarded his advice. On 6 September 1982, after [] departure from Somalia, [] came to the team house and requested the film used to photograph him and [] and money to get it developed from []. Since the film contained other job related photographs, [] told [] to come back the next day, at which time [] gave [] a blank roll of exposed film, thereby retaining the photograph of [] and []. [] had no further contact with [] and departed Somalia on 8 September 1982 (1 & 2).

(U) On the dates indicated, the individuals listed below were interviewed concerning their knowledge of [] association with [] and provided substantially the same information as provided by [] however, did not provide any information to substantiate any indiscretion or [] part wherein he had discussed his travels for the US Government in the Middle East; past assignments for the US Government; and reason for being in Somalia. Consensus was that their association was merely on a friendly basis, and that [] wanted only the photograph taken of him and [] and not job related photographs.

(U) The records of the Defense Index of Investigations (DCII) were examined concerning [] and [] and revealed no derogatory information and no record, respectively.

(U) On 12 and 14 October 1982, the civilian personnel records concerning [] were examined and local agency checks were conducted and revealed no derogatory information (6 & 7).

(U) On 3 December 1982, [redacted], GS-11, QAS, US Army Tank and Automotive Command (TACOM), Warren, MI, was interviewed concerning his association and contact with [redacted] during the period 30 August through 5 September 1982, while in Mogadishu, Somalia, and any subsequent contact. [redacted] met [redacted] as he walked along the beach in Mogadishu, Somalia on 30 August 1982. [redacted] claimed to be a physics and English teacher, and wanted to practice his English with [redacted]. [redacted] invited [redacted] to his house for dinner, and asked [redacted] to provide him American books such as love stories, westerns, novels, and sex books. [redacted] agreed to send him some books when he returned to the US, but needed an address. [redacted] said he would mail [redacted] an address at a later date and requested [redacted] address - which he provided. [redacted] next met [redacted] when he came to the QAS team house to cancel the dinner invitation on 1 September 1982. [redacted] met [redacted] again on 2 September at the QAS team house at which time a photograph was taken of [redacted] and [redacted] by [redacted]. [redacted] last met with [redacted] on 4 September 1982 when he took [redacted] to the American Club for dinner. While at the American Club, [redacted] asked [redacted] for \$ 50.00- to which [redacted] refused. [redacted] upon departing the American Club, had no further contact with [redacted] and left Somalia on 5 September 1982. During their association, their conversations revolved around general topics about Somalia; however, [redacted] did ask if Americans were coming there soon. [redacted] informed [redacted] that he had no knowledge of such matters. [redacted] also talked about getting a scholarship and going to the US to study, and about a friend of his who is studying medicine in Boston, MA. [redacted] denied ever discussing his Middle East travels for the US Government, other than telling [redacted] which Arabic speaking countries he had visited. [redacted] never met any other foreign nationals through [redacted] and was never asked any specific questions concerning his employment by [redacted]. [redacted] did ask when he would be returning to Somalia - to which [redacted] replied that he didn't know. No questions of a military nature were posed by [redacted]. Other than American books, [redacted] requested no written material from [redacted]. [redacted] gave [redacted] a mystery and a western book obtained from co-workers. [redacted] received a letter from [redacted] approximately a week after his return to the US (EXHIBIT X), requesting books. [redacted] has no intentions of maintaining any type contact with [redacted]. [redacted] had reported his contact with [redacted] to the Office of Military Coordination while in Somalia. [redacted] believed [redacted] was looking for someone to sponsor him to get into the US (8).

(U) COMMENTS: [redacted] Based upon investigative results, there is no evidence to substantiate disclosure of military information to unauthorized persons which would adversely affect the security of the US Army, or evidence to indicate HoIS involvement. [redacted] method of approach, request for money from [redacted] and interest in only non-military books/publications is not indicative of a HoIS operative. Recontact/maintenance of contact by [redacted] is considered unlikely. Further investigative effort is not deemed warranted or would result in any positive value from an intelligence standpoint.

(U) On 14 September 1982, [] GS-11, [] Quality Assurance Specialist (QAS), Team Chief, Foreign Military Sales, Product Assurance Directorate, DRSMI-QMD, US Army Missile Command (MICOM), Redstone Arsenal (RSA), Alabama 35809, was interviewed at his office, Room 165, Building 4566, RSA, AL concerning his trip to Mogadishu, Somalia, and provided the following information:

(U) During the period 29 August through 8 September 1982, Source made a trip to Mogadishu, Somalia as part of a Quality Assurance Team, comprised of himself, [] QAS, Supervisor, US Army Security Assistance Command, Fort Bragg, NC, (NFI); [] QAS, (TOW), Anniston Army Depot, Anniston, AL (NFI); [] Mechanic (Vehicles), Red River Army Depot, Texarkana, TX, (NFI); and [] QAS (Vehicles), Tank and Automotive Command (TACOM), Warren, MI (NFI). Purpose of the trip included inventory and set-up of 24 TOW missile equipped M-113 Armored Personnel Carriers furnished by the US to the Somalian Government. Source stated that on the evening of 30 August 1982, [] went for a walk on the beach where he met an unidentified black male whose description is as follows:

Unidentified male (UM) was allegedly an English teacher but had poor command of the English language. A relationship ensued between [] and UM for the duration of [] stay in Somalia which ended on 5 September 1982. [] met UM on 31 August 1982, when [] brought UM to their quarters, a three bedroom house provided by the US Embassy, which was shared by the five team members. Source observed and overheard [] describing to UM, in great detail, his travels for the US Government in the Middle East; his past assignments for the US Government overseas; and his current reason for being in Somalia. UM saw all the technical manuals in their quarters and repeatedly asked for anything written in English for his English class. To Source's knowledge UM was not given any material. By this time Source had become suspicious of UM and obtained a photo of [] and UM while they were in [] room sitting on the bed. Source provided a copy of the photo, attached as EXHIBIT 1. During the period 30 August through 4 September 1982, [] socialized exclusively with UM to include visiting UM's house. [] was with UM each night and returned to his quarters usually between 2300-0100 hours. Members of the team advised [] against fraternizing to closely with UM but he disregarded the advice and continued his association until his departure on 5 September 1982. [] had given the house guard, who was employed by the US Embassy, instructions to allow UM entry into the house. The guard told Source in broken English that UM was "Bad man- Ethiopian". On 6 September 1982, after [] had departed the country, UM again returned to the house and demanded all photographs Source had taken and money to get the film developed. Source said that [] had promised UM that he would provide all the photographs source had taken. Source told UM to return the next day, 7 September 1982, and he would give him the film. Prior to UM's return, Source exposed a new roll of film, rewound it into the cannister and gave it to UM, thereby retaining the actual film used to photograph suspect and other job-related photographs. Source had no additional contact with UM and departed the country on 8 September 1982. Source related that [] has shallow technical expertise, was very immature, naive, and took everything as a big joke. Source felt that [] was not competent nor responsible enough to represent the US Government with other foreign governments. Source indicated that [] was scheduled for another foreign trip representing TACOM in the near future. Source is of the opinion that [] can substantiate Source's observations of [] activities.

Source stated that a fellow coworker, [] Product Assurance Directorate, USAMICOM, RSA, AL (NFI) who had been a classmate of []

On 6 October 1982, [redacted], WG-10, Mechanic, Depot Shops Division, Red River Army Depot (RRAD), Texarkana, Texas 75507, who resides at [redacted] was interviewed at the Texarkana Resident Office, 902d MI Group, RRAD concerning his knowledge of the activities of [redacted] and his contacts with an unidentified male in Mogadisha, Somalia during the period 30 September-5 August 1982. [redacted] was advised of the Privacy Act of 1974. [redacted] executed a DA Form 28 23, Sworn Statement, regarding the information he provided, a copy of which is attached as EXHIBIT IV, the salient points of which are as follows:

[redacted] first met [redacted] on approximately 28 August 1982, when they were enroute to the Federal Republic of Germany and then to Mogadisha, Somalia as part of a US Army Quality Assurance/military assistance team with the mission of preparing and transporting M113 Armored Personnel Carriers/ TOW equipped from the Federal Republic of Germany to Mogadisha. Shortly after their arrival in Mogadisha, [redacted] met an unidentified male, with whom he associated during the stay in Mogadisha. [redacted] brought the unidentified male to the house in which the team was staying on approximately four occasions, and socialized with him on other occasions. [redacted] could provide no identifying data as to the individuals name, address, place of employment or purpose in associating with [redacted]. [redacted] never heard any discussions between [redacted] and the unidentified male, and only conversations with him were limited to amenities.

Other team members, who included [redacted] (phonetic), Cumberland Army Depot, New Cumberland, PA; Mr FNU [redacted]; station unknown; and one other individual, name or station not recalled; and [redacted] Team members wanted [redacted] to report his association with the unidentified male to the local US Commander, but he declined to do this. [redacted] took the unidentified males photograph approximately 9 or 10 September 1982. [redacted] left Mogadisha on 12 September 1982, upon completion of the mission.

On one occasion, a member of the team, [redacted] GS-12, Missile Command, Restone Arsenal, Alabama, was testing his flash unit and took a picture of [redacted] and FN. [redacted] and two other team members, [redacted] GS-12, Red River Army Depot, Texas and [redacted] GS-13, US Army Security Assistance Center, New Cumberland Army Depot, Pennsylvania, departed Somalia on 12 September 1982, and [redacted] and [redacted] remained for several days. Shortly after the other members departed, the FN appeared at the house and demanded the film with the picture of [redacted] and himself. [redacted] was not present when the FN came to the house but [redacted] had informed [redacted] of the incident and also told him that the FN appeared angry when [redacted] did not give him the film. [redacted] told the FN to return the next day for the film and in the interim, [redacted] and [redacted] exposed a blank roll of film. The next day when the FN returned for the film, Source explained that the film has been exposed when the camera was opened and the FN appeared to be disappointed. After speaking with the FN, [redacted] believed there had been a break down in communications and that the FN only wanted the picture of [redacted] and himself as a souvenir, and had no interest in the other photographs. This was reinforced when the FN stated he could get the film developed for 50 Lira, if he could have the picture of [redacted] and himself. [redacted] believed the incident with the film occurred because [redacted] may have informed the FN that if he contacted [redacted], then [redacted] would give him the photo. However, [redacted] apparently failed to inform [redacted] that the FN wanted the picture. Additionally, the FN was not as fluent in the English language as the team believed and this may have led to the misunderstanding when the FN initially appeared for the photo. [redacted] had never heard [redacted] compromise himself by discussing the team's mission in Somalia or [redacted] past assignments and travels with the US Government. Source usually retired each evening at approximately 2230 hours and had no knowledge of [redacted] activities after this time. [redacted] could provide no additional information pertaining to [redacted] activities nor [redacted] association with the FN. [redacted] executed a Sworn Statement, attached as EXHIBIT V.

(U) Other than the initial introduction Source had no further contact with the U/I. The U/I was seen on one occasion, speaking to [] in their residence. At one point during their stay Source advised [] not to associate with individuals not affiliated with the project. [] said that the U/I was OK and nothing was going to happen. [] was seen escorting the U/I to the Anglo-American Club for dinner on one occasion. Source was advised by [] on another occasion, that he would not be going to dinner with the rest of the team since he was invited to the U/I's home for dinner that particular evening. the American Club for dinner. Conversations revolved around general topics about Somalia, however [redacted] did ask if the Americans were coming here soon. [redacted] said he did not have knowledge of such matters. 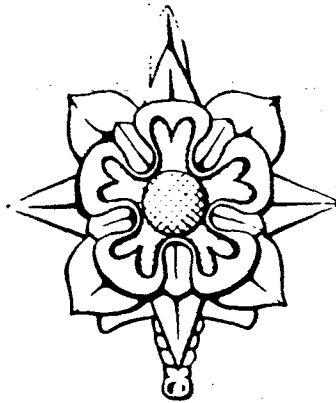

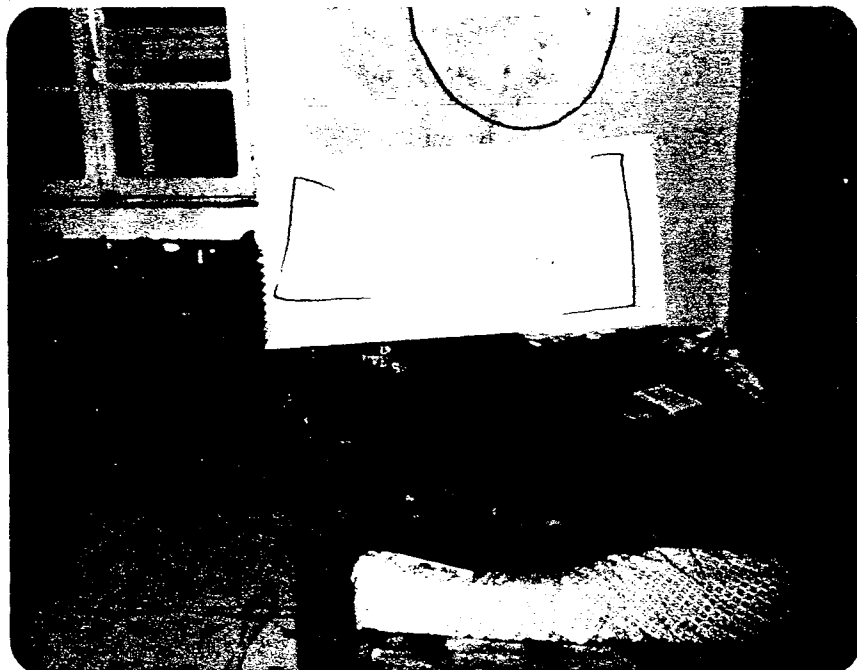

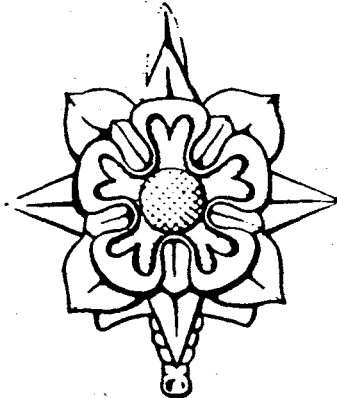

I was assigned to perform a Quality Assurance Team visit in Mogadishu, Somalia 25 Aug 82 thru 10 Sep 82. I was accompanied by and shared the same residence on this visit with Messrs: [redacted] USA Security Assistance Command; [redacted] Anniston Army Depot; [redacted] Red River Army Depot; and [redacted] US Army Tank Command.

Evening of Sunday, 29 Aug 82, [redacted] visited a beach near our place of lodging. On his return he told us that he had met a Somali English teacher on the beach that was very friendly and likeable. Evening of Monday 30 Aug 82, [redacted] again visited the beach and brought his friend (Somali English teacher) to our quarters and introduced him to the team. After the Somali departed, [redacted] and I discussed the question, as to whether this type socializing was wise. I suggested that [redacted] point out some reasons to [redacted] that he should discretely avoid bringing his friend into our residence. He talked to [redacted] about this matter, and [redacted] explained that "this man is O.K." and he was only interested in some English reading material. Evening of 31 Aug 82, [redacted] left our residence to have dinner at his friends home. He came back early and said his friend had cancelled due to unexpected visit by Nomad relatives. I mentioned that I needed a battery for my camera. [redacted] said his friend could purchase a 9V battery. Evening of 1 Sep 82, [redacted] friend came to our residence. I mentioned the battery. He volunteered to purchase some. I gave him 200 Somali Shillings. Myself and other team members, except [redacted] and his friend went to the Anglo-American Club for dinner. and his friend arrived shortly thereafter. They dined alone. Evening of 2 Sep 82, [redacted] friend visited our residence and delivered 2 ea, 9V batteries. I heard him and [redacted] discussing our job (TOW), [redacted] travels in the Mid-East and English reading material. I walked to the door of [redacted] room and took their picture. Evening of 3 and 4 Sep 82, [redacted] and this person visited in [redacted] room. This man showed an interest as he passed a stack of TM handbooks, etc. 5 Sep 82, Messrs: [redacted] and [redacted] departed Mogadishu at 10:30 PM. Evening of 6 Sep 82, our guard (Employee of American Embassy) knocked on our door and motioned me to the gate. The Somali ([redacted] friend) was wanting to enter. I told him we were busy. He said [redacted] told him I would give him reading material and "the photographs". I asked him what photographs and he said he wanted the roll that had the picture I made. I told him that was not possible, as 23 more pictures were on that roll. He said he must have them. I told him that I would give them to him the following afternoon, as I needed time to identify that roll. I went back to my room and in the presence of [redacted] unrolled and exposed a new roll of film and placed in a paper bag. Evening of 7 Sep 82, Same individual came to yard gate and insisted that guard allow him entry. The guard summoned me (I was accompanied by [redacted] USA TACOM and [redacted] USA TACOM sharing residence) to the gate. He was handed the bag containing exposed film. He said he must have 50 Shillings and I refused. He

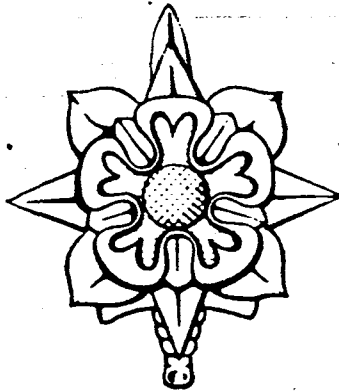

WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

I first met [redacted] at Kennedy International Airport, New York, on approximately 28 August 1982. We were both part of a team travelling to Kaiserslautern, Federal Republic of Germany and on to Mogadisha, Somalia. Other members of the team, whom I later met, were [redacted] from New Cumberland Army Depot, New Cumberland, PA; [redacted] team chief, station unknown, [redacted] one other individual whose name I do not recall and myself. Our job, which was somewhat covert, in that our orders did not reflect our mission or specific destinations, was to prepare and move to Somalia, 24 TOW equipped M113 Armored Personnel Carriers from USAREUR war stocks located in the Kaiserslautern area. We arrived in Germany on approximately 28 or 29 August 82, worked there for approximately three days and departed for Somalia on approximately 2 or 3 September 1982. The M113 vehicles were transported by chartered 747 aircraft which were loaded and departed from Ramstein Air Force Base, Ramstein, Federal Republic of Germany. [redacted] and I accompanied one of the first loads to Mogadisha, and the rest of the team followed with the other vehicles. We arrived in Mogadisha at approximately mid-day, 2 or 3 September 1982. We were furnished a house on the economy to live by the local US military commander. I do not know the address of the house. During the time we were in Mogadisha, the only place to after duty hours was the UN club. [redacted] I would go to the club alone, and walk the beach which was by the club. Shortly after our arrival in Mogadisha, [redacted] met an unidentified black male, believed to be Somali or Ethiopian, name not known, height: 72"; weight: 150 lbs; slender build; age 28-33 years; narrow, slim face; dressed in slacks, sports shirt, neat, well dressed and who always wore a wide, western type beige belt. [redacted] said he had met him on the beach at the UN club, that the unidentified male told him that he was a schoolteacher, his father worked at the US embassy. During our stay in Mogadisha, [redacted] brought the man to our house approximately four times. The rest of the team was concerned about this, as we had six TOW batteries and a battery charger in the house in plain sight. After the first or second time [redacted] brought him to the house, the team suggested [redacted] notify the military commander of the US assistance team, but [redacted] refused to do so, explaining he believed the individuals story. The unidentified man visited the house approximately four times with [redacted]. At no time did he engage in any conversations with other members of the team, other than to exchange amenities. On one occasion [redacted] had been invited to dinner at the mans house, location unknown, but the invitation was later withdrawn with a story about visitors "coming in from the bush". On another occasion, the man volunteered to take the team members on a tour into the jungle.

Team members were told by () that this contact with an unknown individual was nothing unusual, that he met people wherever he went and liked to meet new people. 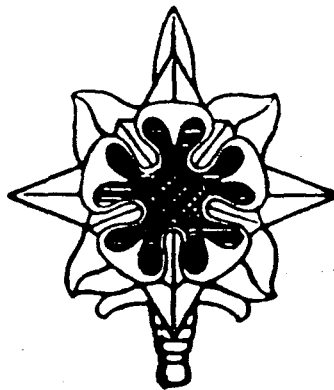

WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

I first met *1.5* *20 September 1982* in Mogadisha, Somalia, where we were members of a team to set up 24 TOW equipped M113 Armored Personnel Carriers for the Somalia government. We lived together in the same house and I saw him daily on the job as well as the evenings at the house. *He* departed Somalia for the United States on *15* September 1982 and I departed several days later. *He* was ten to fifteen years younger than the rest of the team and *occasionally went* ~~always going~~ for walks, or runs along the beach. On one of these occasions, *he* a Foreign National, I believe he was from Somalia. I don't recall his name but he was roughly 5'6" to 5'9", slim built, neat dresser and spoke English well enough to communicate. This individual visited our quarters twice with *him* and once went to dinner with *him* at the Anglo-American Club. On one occasion, when the Foreign National was visiting at the house with *him*, *he* was testing his flash unit for his camera and in addition to several pictures he took, he also took a picture of *him* and the individual. On 5 September 1982 *he* and two members of the team *left* Somalia to return to the states, their job completed. The Foreign National stopped by our quarters and demanded the film that had a picture of him and *him* it. I was not around at the time but *he* told me that the individual became very angry about the film. After *he* explained to me what had happened, we decided *to* give him an exposed roll of blank film. When the Foreign National showed up *the* following day, I explained to him that the film exposed and he seemed disappointed. After talking with the Foreign National, I had the feeling he just wanted the picture of him and *him* as a souvenir and was not interested in the rest of the film. He had offered to get the film developed so he could have a copy of the picture of him and *him*. I believe this whole incident occurred because *he* forgot to mention to *him* that the Foreign National wanted a copy of the picture and the individual did not fully understand the English language. I never heard *him* discuss the team's mission in Somalia, his job, or his past missions for the US Government. After the incident occurred *he* and I decided he would report the incident when he returned to Redstone Arsenal.

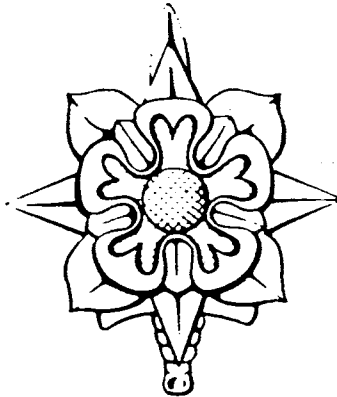

The remaining individuals returned home and approximately 35 minutes later were joined by and another individual (local national) he had met on the beach. introduced the young man as a friend of his. I had no further conversation with the individual that evening or during one return visit. as to have visited the young man's house for dinner but this was put off as the young man told that they had company and there were just too many people at his house. did, on one occasion, take the young man to the Anglo-American Club for dinner one evening. I cautioned about making friends or having contacts with local people whom he was not working directly with. He apparently felt the young man posed no problem or threat to anyone. and myself departed country approximately 8 Sep 82. and departed 4/5 days later. I received a telephone call from (MICOM) who stated that the young man who associated with had returned to the house on two occasions after had already left for CONUS and caused some disturbance, apparently over some film that had been promised him. The best I can recall is that gave him (the young man) some film he had already exposed. I request confidentiality.
