Mr. Hays frowns on any photographs emanating from Hollywood featuring the stars in sweaters or gowns cut to display the feminine form divine. The movie (and stills) that displeased Mr. Hays was "Rookies on Parade", a Republic picture, which stars Marie Wilson. Throughout the entire picture Marie wears sweaters and snug-fitting dresses and as a result the Hays office refused to okay the movie. All scenes taken of Miss Wilson had to be re-shot. Simultaneously, the Hays office issued a letter, signed by Joseph I. Breen, forbidding "shots of low-cut dresses which expose women's breasts, as well as 'sweater shots'-sbots in which the breasts of women are clearly outlined and emphasized." ## WINGMEN'S

 WEST POINTWITH cries of "sabotage" and "bottleneck" echoing from every defense production center, it is indeed gratifying to know of one place that saboteurs cannot touch-Randolph Field, Texas, now known as "The West Point of the Air". Here pilots of fighter planes are being turned out in rapid fire succession to man mighty fighting ships. The series of phntos on this page, made through the courtesy of the powers that be at Randolph Field, gives you an idea of life in this school where groundlings are transformed into winged warriors.

When the history of this great defense effort is written, as it will be eventually, Randolph Field will probably he given a chapter all to itself. For this great training center is turning out pilots at a rate undreamed of in the days before Uncle Sam rolled up his sleeves and decided that the only way he could feel secure was to have an army and an air force second to none in the world.

Approximately 700 young fliers are trained at Randolph Field every ten weeks. After completing their course here they are sent to the advanced school at Kelly Field for the final leg of their journey towards the "wings" of full-fledged commissioned officers in the U. S. Army Air Corps. A simple calculation gives you the figure of some 3,500 fliers as the annual production of the "West Point of the Air". That figure, may we add, is conservalive.
