JOHN PHILIP SOUSA, the bandmaster, ever alert to the whims and caprices of the American public, emphaalzed his . patriotism on the glorious Fourth at At-lantic City, N. J., by the introduction of a unique musical number entitled "Blaze Away." The composition is a comminging of catchy melodic movements portraying the incidents of the battle of Manila Bay. The "Blaze Away" composition was in-spired by an American composer, Abe Holz-mana by name, who utilized the incident of Dewey's triumph upon the battle ahip Olym-



pla when the brave Captain Gridley was awaiting ordera from his superior.You may fire when you are ready!" said Dewey.

Dewey. "Well, boys, let's blaze away!" came the quick rejoinder, and the guns poured their deadly contents into the enemy. In the apirit of the letter Composer Hoiz-mann incorporated into bis musical com-position the deep meaning of these words. The grumbling of the guns as they poured shot and shell into the vitals of the Spanish fleet, the cry of the sinking foe, the burst-ing of the shells, the wild wall of anguish and despair from the writbing survivors, com-mingled with the death deating projectiles as they flew into the holds and upon the decks of the dismantied battle ships, are one and sil graphically repeated in melodic atructure in "Blaze Away."

Composer Holzmann, though a German by birth, is the originator of many famous. American dances and musical numbers, such as "Smoky Mokes," "A Bunch o' Black-berrice."
