



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This song is arranged for both soprano and contralto voices and makes a beautiful solo for either sex in either voice. But the best results are achieved when it is sung as a duet by a lady and gentleman who stand near the front of the stage about six feet apart, the lady on the left.

The gentleman should sing the first verse alone, the lady responding with "Wait Love, O wait." The Refrain is then sung in concert, the lady leading and making all necessary gestures. When they sing the words, "'Twill be time enough my dear," the lady should approach her companion holding out her right hand, which he grasps in his right, and, as they sing the next strain, "Then to say the day is near," he draws her to his left side, placing his left arm around her. She looks up in his eyes, the music pauses a moment, then she sings, "And kiss your little girl good bye." These last words should be sung by the lady alone. Then they resume their original positions, the second verse is sung and the refrain repeated. "The Wait Love Fairy Dance," which will be found on the last page, is arranged for the music of the refrain only, and the orchestra should not repeat any other part of the music for the Fairy Dance.
