# NAG C Library Function Document nag dppcon (f07ggc)

## 1 Purpose

nag\_dppcon (f07ggc) estimates the condition number of a real symmetric positive-definite matrix A, where A has been factorized by nag\_dpptrf (f07gdc), using packed storage.

# 2 Specification

## 3 Description

nag\_dppcon (f07ggc) estimates the condition number (in the 1-norm) of a real symmetric positive-definite matrix A:

$$\kappa_1(A) = ||A||_1 ||A^{-1}||_1.$$

Since A is symmetric,  $\kappa_1(A) = \kappa_{\infty}(A) = ||A||_{\infty} ||A^{-1}||_{\infty}$ .

Because  $\kappa_1(A)$  is infinite if A is singular, the function actually returns an estimate of the **reciprocal** of  $\kappa_1(A)$ .

The function should be preceded by a call to nag\_dsp\_norm (f16rdc) to compute  $||A||_1$  and a call to nag\_dpptrf (f07gdc) to compute the Cholesky factorization of A. The function then uses Higham's implementation of Hager's method (see Higham (1988)) to estimate  $||A^{-1}||_1$ .

## 5 Parameters

1: **order** – Nag OrderType

Input

On entry: the **order** parameter specifies the two-dimensional storage scheme being used, i.e., row-major ordering or column-major ordering. C language defined storage is specified by **order** = **Nag\_RowMajor**. See Section 2.2.1.4 of the Essential Introduction for a more detailed explanation of the use of this parameter.

Constraint: order = Nag\_RowMajor or Nag\_ColMajor.

2: **uplo** – Nag UploType

Input

On entry: indicates whether A has been factorized as  $U^TU$  or  $LL^T$  as follows:

if  $\mathbf{uplo} = \mathbf{Nag\_Upper}$ ,  $A = U^T U$ , where U is upper triangular;

if **uplo** = Nag\_Lower,  $A = LL^T$ , where L is lower triangular.

Constraint: uplo = Nag\_Upper or Nag\_Lower.

n - Integer

Input

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On entry: n, the order of the matrix A.

Constraint:  $\mathbf{n} \geq 0$ .

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4: ap[dim] – const double

Input

**Note:** the dimension, dim, of the array **ap** must be at least  $max(1, \mathbf{n} \times (\mathbf{n} + 1)/2)$ .

On entry: the Cholesky factor of A stored in packed form, as returned by nag dpptrf (f07gdc).

5: **anorm** – double *Inpu* 

On entry: the 1-norm of the **original** matrix A, which may be computed by calling nag\_dsp\_norm (f16rdc). **anorm** must be computed either **before** calling nag\_dpptrf (f07gdc) or else from a copy of the original matrix A.

Constraint:  $anorm \ge 0.0$ .

6: **rcond** – double \*

Output

On exit: an estimate of the reciprocal of the condition number of A. roond is set to zero if exact singularity is detected or the estimate underflows. If roond is less than machine precision, A is singular to working precision.

7: **fail** – NagError \*

Output

The NAG error parameter (see the Essential Introduction).

## 6 Error Indicators and Warnings

#### NE\_INT

```
On entry, \mathbf{n} = \langle value \rangle.
Constraint: \mathbf{n} \geq 0.
```

#### **NE REAL**

```
On entry, anorm = \langle value \rangle.
Constraint: anorm \geq 0.0.
```

#### NE\_ALLOC\_FAIL

Memory allocation failed.

## NE\_BAD\_PARAM

On entry, parameter \( \nabla value \rangle \) had an illegal value.

#### **NE INTERNAL ERROR**

An internal error has occurred in this function. Check the function call and any array sizes. If the call is correct then please consult NAG for assistance.

## 7 Accuracy

The computed estimate **rcond** is never less than the true value  $\rho$ , and in practice is nearly always less than  $10\rho$ , although examples can be constructed where **rcond** is much larger.

### **8** Further Comments

A call to nag\_dppcon (f07ggc) involves solving a number of systems of linear equations of the form Ax = b; the number is usually 4 or 5 and never more than 11. Each solution involves approximately  $2n^2$  floating-point operations but takes considerably longer than a call to nag\_dpptrs (f07gec) with 1 right-hand side, because extra care is taken to avoid overflow when A is approximately singular.

The complex analogue of this function is nag zppcon (f07guc).

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## 9 Example

To estimate the condition number in the 1-norm (or infinity-norm) of the matrix A, where

$$A = \begin{pmatrix} 4.16 & -3.12 & 0.56 & -0.10 \\ -3.12 & 5.03 & -0.83 & 1.18 \\ 0.56 & -0.83 & 0.76 & 0.34 \\ -0.10 & 1.18 & 0.34 & 1.18 \end{pmatrix}.$$

Here A is symmetric positive-definite, stored in packed form, and must first be factorized by nag\_dpptrf (f07gdc). The true condition number in the 1-norm is 97.32.
