# Calibrating NI 5112 Digitizers with Calibration Executive

This document contains step-by-step instructions for loading and running the National Instruments Calibration Executive procedure for NI 5112 digitizers.

## **Equipment and Other Test Requirements**

This section describes the equipment, documentation, software, and test conditions needed for calibration.

#### **Test Equipment**

Tables 1 and 2 list specifications for equipment you can use to calibrate the NI 5112 with Calibration Executive.

#### **Recommended Equipment**

Table 1 lists the equipment that NI recommends for this procedure.

If you do not have the recommended instruments, use the accuracy requirements listed above to select a substitute calibration standard. Refer to Table 2 for a list of alternative instruments you can use for the calibration procedure. Although these instruments are acceptable, NI recommends that you use the instruments from Table 1.

#### **Test Conditions**

Follow these guidelines to optimize the connections and the environment during calibration:

- Keep connections to the NI 5112 short. Long cables and wires act as antennae, picking up extra noise that can affect measurements.
- Use a 50  $\Omega$  BNC coaxial cable for all connections to the digitizer if you are not using a Fluke 9500 calibrator.
- Keep relative humidity between 10% and 90%, noncondensing, or consult the digitizer hardware manual for the optimum relative humidity.
- Maintain the temperature between 25 °C and 35 °C.
- Allow a warm-up time of at least 15 minutes to ensure that the measurement circuitry of the NI 5112 is at a stable operating temperature.

## **Calibration Procedures**

This section explains how to set up and run the Calibration Executive procedure.

Using the Fluke 9500 in automated mode, the calibration procedure takes approximately 10 minutes. In manual mode, the procedure takes approximately 30 minutes.

Using the alternative instruments in automated mode, the calibration procedure takes approximately 20 minutes. In manual mode, the procedure takes approximately 40 minutes.

#### Connecting the Calibrator, DMM, and NI 5112

The calibration procedure guides you through the connections between the calibrator, sine wave generator, DMM, and NI 5112.

#### **Running the Calibration Executive Procedure**

To run the Calibration Executive calibration procedure, complete the following steps:

- Launch Calibration Executive and follow the Calibration Configuration Wizard to load the NI 5112 calibration procedure. Refer to Chapter 1, *Introduction to Calibration Executive*, of the *Calibration Executive Software User Manual* if you need more information on configuring and loading a calibration procedure.
- 2. When prompted by Calibration Executive, enter information about the instruments you are using.
- **Note** The Fluke 9500 is the only oscilloscope calibrator currently supported through GPIB control. You can run the calibration procedure in manual mode if you have another type of oscilloscope calibrator. If you do not have an oscilloscope calibrator, use the alternative instruments listed in Table 2 and run the calibration procedure in manual mode. You can add information about the alternative instruments in the Notes section of the Calibration Configuration Wizard. NI recommends that when prompted for the Scope Calibrator information, you include a list of all three alternative instruments, along with their associated tracking numbers and calibration due dates, in the Notes section. When the calibration report is generated, this information appears in the section labeled Scope Calibrator. You may want to preface your instrument list with the following text: Instead of using a scope calibrator.

- 3. When the procedure is loaded, click **Run Procedure** to begin. The procedure prompts you to enter the device number, which is the number assigned by Measurement & Automation Explorer (MAX).
- 4. Follow any instructions you receive from Calibration Executive.

#### Viewing the Calibration Report

When the calibration procedure is finished, complete the following steps to view the calibration report:

- 1. Select View»Reports.
- 2. Click View.

#### Modifying the Font Size in a Calibration Report

If you have selected the HTML format and the text size in the calibration report is too large, you can decrease the size as follows:

- In Internet Explorer, modify the text size by selecting **View»Text Size** and then selecting the appropriate size from the menu.
- In Netscape, modify the text size by selecting View»Decrease Font.



**Note** If your NI 5112 digitizer fails after calibration, return it to NI for repair or replacement.
